Message From The Placement Coordinator





The Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India (EDI) is an autonomous and not-for-profit Institute, set up in 1983 with the support of leading financial institutions like; the IDBI Bank Ltd., ICICI Ltd., IFCI Ltd. and the State Bank of India. The Government of Gujarat pledged twenty three acres of land on which stands the majestic and sprawling EDI campus.

EDI's pioneering activities in entrepreneurship development training have established that people from all walks of life can become business owners. It has demolished the myth that the entrepreneurs are born, and not made. Through well conceived training interventions and capacity building activities, over the last 25 years, EDI has equipped a few thousand people with entrepreneurial skills. EDI has been spearheading entrepreneurship movement throughout the nation, by organising various training programs, workshops and research projects under strategic thrust areas, thereby advancing the frontiers of theories and practices of entrepreneurship and effectively contributing to the nation's economic vitality.

EDI has earned great deal of national and international recognition for its pioneering work as reflected in the support it has received from the World Bank, International Labor Organization, UNIDO, Commonwealth Secretariat and several other international agencies. Post Graduate Diploma in Management of Non Government Organisations (PGDMN)

Post Graduate Diploma in Management of Non-Government Organizations (PGDMN) programme is designed for those who wish to;

- provide leadership to social development initiatives
- set up an NGO
- develop themselves as professionals dedicated towards the social development agenda

The Post Graduate Programme in Management of NGOs was conceived at EDI way back in 1998 as the need was felt to initiate the process of capacity building of those interested in joining the development sector and contributing towards making life better for others. The course is structured in four parts; the philosophical or the perspective domain; the strategic management and decision making domain the human resource management domain, and the structures, systems, tools, and technique domain (including monitoring and financial management). They all add up towards creating and developing managers who will have the required vision as well as necessary skills to handle various tools for making effective decisions thereby increasing and improving overall organizational performance. The programme also aims at qualifying people in planning and managing developmental works, in rural and urban contexts.

Over the ten years, the programme has evolved into one of the most sought after courses. Till date, 234 students hailing from twenty five states and possessing diverse educational background have successfully completed the programme. These students are working with the reputed development organizations (local to global) and have successfully demonstrated their capacities to manage programmes, in addition to initiating the process of establishing their own organizations.

The one-year PG Programme gives students a good grounding in both practice and theories. The programme distributed over four semesters with a total input of 810 hours (classrooms & project work) makes it equivalent to inputs, which many other post graduate programmes offer over a period of two years. The interactions that the students have with practitioners, the case study and group learning methodology make students develop in-depth understanding of the subjects and the managerial tools.

DIPLOMA:

Students, on successful completion of the programme, are awarded the **Post Graduate Diploma in Management of Non Government Organizations.**

PGDMN



The Internship programme aims to broaden the perspective of the students by providing them with the opportunity to blend real life experience in a voluntary development organization with the theories that they learn in the classrooms. The internship component provides opportunities to understand various aspects of the voluntary organization and also gives the organization a scope to know and obtain an independent assessment of a programme or a process. This internship programme is for a period of five weeks. At the end of this internship students prepare a dissertation/report on their findings. The formal sharing of the dissertation done with a panel of experts that includes academicians and practitioners, and is graded. The students also submit a copy of this report to the host organization. Many of our students, while on internship, receive pre-placement offers, i.e. before final placement, on the basis of the quality of work during internship assignments with the organization.

PEDAGOGY

The interactive nature of the learning experience distinguishes EDI from many other institutions. The emphasis is more on action learning, computer simulation, live projects, role plays, case-based teachings, field work and group work combine to create a challenging environment to define problems and find workable solutions.

Teaching and guidance are principally provided by EDI Faculty and selectively supported by a host of experts from leading educational institutions and experts/ leaders from voluntary organizations.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

A bachelor's degree in any discipline is essential for admission to PGDMN programme. The students for the course are enrolled on the basis of a national level written test and personal interview. The objective of the selection procedure is to gauge their attitude and commitment towards the development sector.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

The nature of opportunities for PGDMN graduates is seen in a range that extends from service delivery to community development, to organizing communities for change and organizing training programme for capacity building for local groups, government officials or for other specialized groups. They are today involved in providing policy inputs at various levels of decision-making within government agencies, advocacy work for the disadvantaged sections and documentation of development activities. The course trains students for development work in areas such as; natural resource management, gender human rights, education, health, micro-enterprise development and livelihood promotion etc. Students from the past nine batches are involved with agencies working at the grassroots to that of multilateral agencies

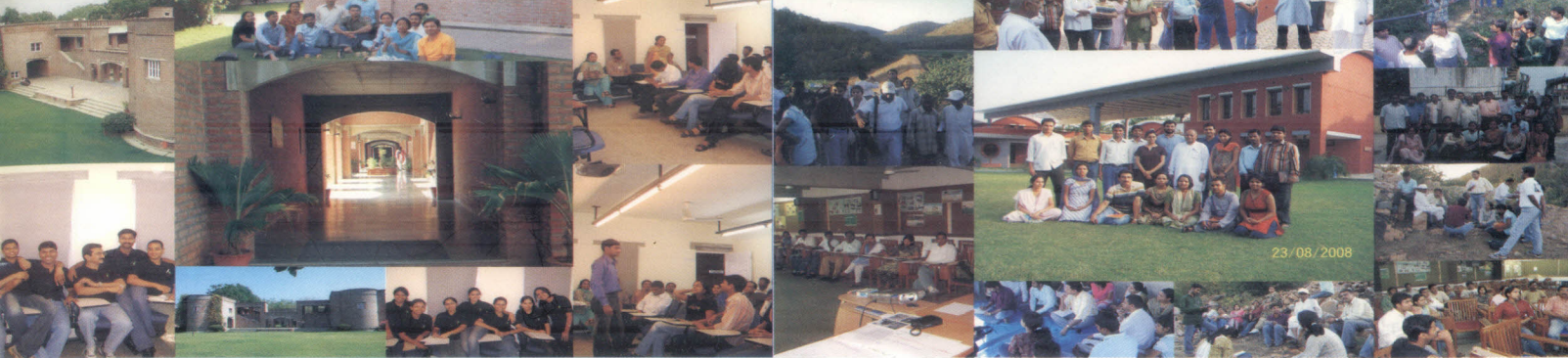

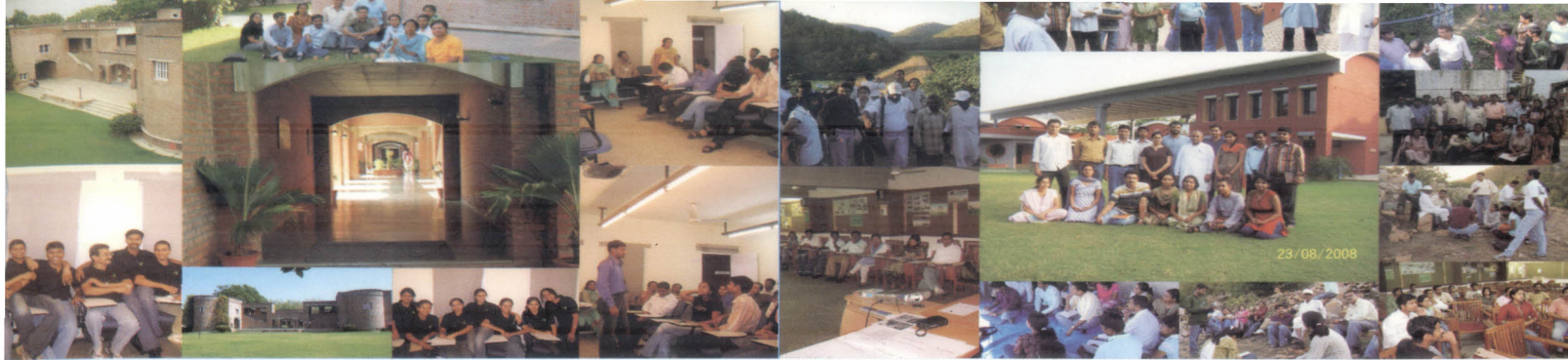

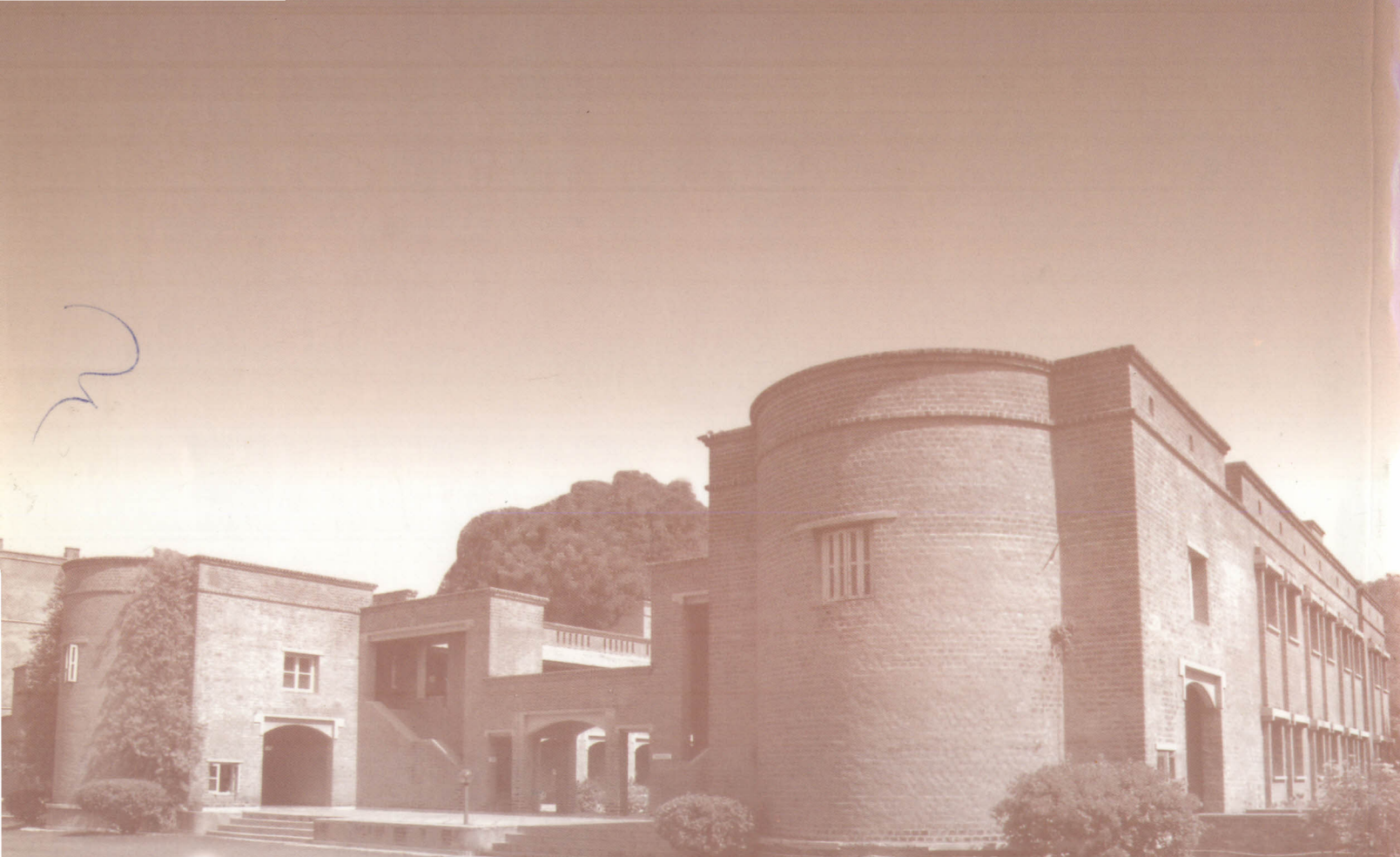
