PROGRESS REPORT ON EDP AT PORT BLAIR

INTRODUCTION

As a result of visit of Inter-Institutional team comprising of senior executives of IDBI, SBI, CED, WBFC and WEBCON, a decision was taken to conduct Entrepreneurship Development Programme at Port Blair to encourage, motivate and train indigenous entrepreneurs. The Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India, Ahmedabad set up by all-India Financial Institutions (IDBI, ICICI, SBI, IFCI) had taken up the responsibility of conducting training programme, which has been sponsored by IDBI, Director of Industries, A & N Administration, WEBCON, and State Bank of India. This was initiated with a view to accelerate the entrepreneurship and to build up climate for (Small Scale) industrial development to promote self-employment, thus in turn creating new employment opportunities.

PRE-TRAINING PREPARATIONS

EDI team of experts (trainers) visited A & N Islands to undertake this activity. A full time experienced

trainer has been posted at Port Blair since 9th September 1983 to conduct and coordinate this EDP with the help of local developmental agencies. During initial promotional work, identification of entrepreneurs and viable project ideas, were the priority areas. After a careful study and support and involvement of local agencies, like Directorate of Industries, District Industries Centre, WEBCON, it was possible to identify about 56 potential entrepreneurs and more than 60 project ideas. This was achieved by advertising the programme on local newspapers, by spreading the message through all-India Radio, over and above various meetings with traders, businessmen, officers and door to door contacts in and around Andaman and Nicobar Islands. A visit to Mayabunder and Diglipur was also made to discuss about the programme with Pradhans of the block by a team of trainers (EDI) and IPO, Directorate of Industries.

SELECTION OF ENTREPRENEURS

In order to achieve the objectives meaningfully, scientific and systematic selection of entrepreneurs was proposed. The selection process involved two stage selection as described below:-

- (1) Written test scheduled on 18th October, 1983 to test the latent entrepreneurial traits in potential entrepreneurs.
- (2) Personal interviews, scheduled on 19th Oct., 1983 to get overall idea about the project, feasibility of setting up the unit and capabilities of entrepreneurs.

It is without any restrictions to education or experience that potential applicants have been motivated and have been selected. The major thrust was on entrepreneurial traits and sincerity, and willingness to set up venture by the potential entrepreneurs.

The committee interviewed the candidates in detail and have selected 29 entrepreneurs. The final list of candidates selected for EDP is enclosed herewith as ANNEXURE-A, showing details of their background and projects proposed.

#### TRAINING PROGRAMME

The first phase of the programme is scheduled to commence on 20th October, 1983. Director of Industries

has provided the class room facility to conduct the programme in their office. The first phase would impart the information inputs, the procedural requirements for setting up unit and business opportunity guidance about potential ventures. All experts and officers of various developmental agencies like, Banks, would be involved to impart training to entrepreneurs. At the end of the first phase, preliminary project report will be prepared by entrepreneurs, assessing their requirements of infrastructure, finance and detailed market survey.

During the second phase of the training, trainees will be visiting Gujarat, Ahmedabad (Mainland) for technical training and orientation and motivational training. This would help them in getting relevant information and exposure to industries for which they are preparing their specific project report. This would also include sessions on production planning, purchase planning, costing, breakeven analysis, etc. This is scheduled between second week of November to end of December, 1983.

The third and final phase of training would be imparted at Port Blair on operational management aspects like finance, marketing, accounts, taxation, management, industrial psychology etc. The trainees will be helped to facilitate their implementation and establishment of the unit.

Thus complete package of training inputs are aimed to enable potential entrepreneurs to easily and expeditiously implement their project and run it successfully.

#### CONCLUSIONS

It is through this first EDP that step towards encouraging entrepreneurship in developing the industrially backward islands of Andaman and Nicobar would create the tempo and atmosphere of development. However, in order to continuously generate and motivate indigenous entrepreneurs, it is advisable that such EDP may be taken up frequently by an appropriate local agency. It is expected that after achieving encourageable results, sufficient interest would be generated in the Islands of Andaman and Nicobar.

PROGRESS REPORT OF PORT BLAIR EDP (2ND PH.)

While finalising the strategy for EDP of Port Blair, it was decided that the selected trainees will be brought to Gujarat for business exposure and technical training. It was felt that their interaction with the local businessmen and their exposure to factories set up by entrepreneur in Gujarat will give them an understanding about the important aspects of managing small-scale enterprises. With this objective, after the completion of the 1st Phase of the training programme at Port Blair, the trainees were brought to Gujarat.

The trainees stayed in Gujarat from November 15, 1983 to December 13, 1983 during the discussion on product process, marketing and finance, was arranged with the consultant of technical consultancy organisation, financial institutions, professionals and successful entrepreneurs of Gujarat. Following is the detail for the training input provided to the trainees during their stay:-

(A) MOTIVATION INPUT

5 days Motivational Input specially designed for strengthening entrepreneurial characteristics was imparted to these trainees. Senior Executives of EDI and expert on Motivational Training called on these sessions. During these sessions, the trainees were made aware of themselves and their personal strength and weaknesses. Strategy for each individual was designed to re-mould their personality. Emphasis was given on the building process to inculcate the need for achievement in the trainees' thinking process.

(B) CLASS ROOM SESSIONS

The core entrepreneurial faculty of EDI supported by the core faculty of CED took certain sessions related to Project Report preparation, project implementation and management. Professionals from outside were also invited for certain areas such as Marketing Management, Sales and Advertisement,

Production Planning and Control, Financial Management, Costing etc. A successful entrepreneur was called to brief the trainees about his experiences of getting into entrepreneurial activity. His experiences were analysed and the trainees were briefed about the characteristics of a successful entrepreneur. The details of the sessions taken during their stay is given in ANNEXURE A.

(c) FACTORY VISIT

Before placing the trainees for Technical Training, visits to various industrial units were organised. The details regarding the units selected for placing the trainees for this field visits are given in ANNEXURE B. The trainees were briefed about the units and the kind of question they should pose and discuss with the owners of the industrial units selected for field visit. On an average, a trainee has visited 30 units. The units were carefully selected after considering the products selected by the entrepreneurs for their venture.

(D) TECHNICAL INPUT

After the completion of Field visit, the trainees were placed in the respective unit in order to get experience in the process-knowledge for the product that they have selected for their venture. The details regarding the units selected for placing the trainees for practical training is given in ANNEXURE C. The trainees were placed in an industrial unit for approximately 10 days. Technical sessions were also organised with the Consultant of TCO and various experts in the production process of different items before placing the trainees in the factory for practical training. A review session was arranged in the evening with the Port Blari trainer and the Sr. Executive of EDI in order to get a feed-back of their technical training input. For certain products such as Fishery, EDI Had a problem in locating a unit where technical training can be imparted. In such cases, the trainees were sent to different places such as: Veraval (coast of Arabian sea), Junagadh (Saurashtra), Umreth and Thasra (Central Gujarat).

(E) PROJECT REPORT PREPARATION

In the early parts of the Second Phase, the trainees were imparted training on the areas where they would get some guidance on project report preparation. Subsequently, the trainees were asked to obtain quotations for raw-material, machinery and equipment in order to finalise their project report details. A common format to facilitate the trainees for analysing the data for project report was prepared and given to the trainees.

The Second Phase of the training programme is completed and some of the important sessions of the Third Phase were also arranged during their stay in Gujarat. A tentative training schedule for Third Phase is prepared and will be finalised after getting in touch with the faculty concerned at Port Blair.

PROGRESS REPORT ON PORT BLAIR EDP-3RD PHASE

After the completion of the 2nd Phase of Entrepreneurship Development Training Programme, the Trainees of Andaman and Nicobar EDP left for Port Blair on December 13, 1983. As stated in the earlier report, during their stay in Gujarat, they were imparted motivation input, key sessions project report preparation and technical input. Following is the progress of the programme during the Third Phase.

1.0 TRAINING INPUT

Normally, sessions related to project implementation and management are covered in the 3rd Phase. But the trainees were to visit Gujarat and therefore, it was decided to take certain sessions implementation and management during their stay in Gujarat as the core faculty and experts in these fields are easily available at EDII Headquarter.

..2..

During the 3rd Phase at Port Blair, sessions on labour laws, factory act, project report discussion, assessment and management of working capital, breakeven analysis etc. were taken. The details of the topics covered in the third phase and the sessions taken are given in ANNEXURE 1.

The Third Phase commenced on January 1, 1984 but the class room sessions were started from January 5, 1984 as some of the trainees were at Calcutta or Madras for collecting some information related to their project.

During this phase, technical literature on the sessions covered was prepared and circulated to the trainees.

## 2.0 PROJECT REPORT PREPARATION

During Gujarat stay, necessary supporting documents for preparing project report were collected. The trainees were also provided

information on technical process and market for the product so that they can complete the write up of their project report after reaching Port Blair. A standard format for preparing the Project Report was developed by EDI trainers which was circulated to all the trainees in order to have a uniformity in the presentation approach.

During the third phase, trainees were called individually to discuss the details of their project report. EDI trainer assisted trainees in formulating their project report. Everyday 6 to 7 hours were spent in order to provide enough time to each trainee for individual discussions. To get the project reports uniformly typed, an arrangement for typing services was also made by EDI trainer.

General Manager, District Industries Centre, Manager (Credit), DIC, the Director of Industries and the local consultant of WEBCON were

also consulted for assisting the trainees in finalising the details of their project report. As a result of careful and detailed planning, it was possible for 23 trainees to finalise the project three trainees could not finalise as some important information for the same was not available in time. Quotations had been called for from Gujarat in order to complete their report within a fortnight.

3.0 SSI REGISTRATION:

In order to qualify for financial assistance at a lower interest rate, it was decided to make the trainees apply for SSI Registration in time so that the loan applications are appraised and sanctioned at the terms and conditions applicable to approved SSI Units. The details of processing SSI Registration applications were discussed with General Manager, District Industries Centre and Director of Industries who agreed to process all the applications on priority basis. For

For SSI Registration, 23 applications were submitted to the Office of District Industries Centre out of which, 9 trainees have already received their Registration Number and the remaining 14 trainees are likely to receive the same within a short time.

#### 4.0 FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENT

Before the commencement of the programme, EDI Senior Executives had discussed about the possibility of organising a loan campaign at Port Blair so that all the applications of the trainees are processed on priority basis and sanction letters are issued within a very short time.

During SSI AND EDI In-House Workshop held at Ahmedabad on December 29 & 30, 1983, the details in this respect, were again discussed with the Development Manager (SIB), State Bank of India, Calcutta, who agreed to provide all support for organising this campaign at Port Blair.

..6..

Since all the project reports were prepared in time and very well scrutinised by EDI trainer/motivator/project formulator, SBI Team agreed to spend about a week in Port Blair and process these applications on campaign basis. A team of 4 officers from SBI, Calcutta region, camped at Port Blair from January 16-26, 1984 and processed all the applications.

20 applications were submitted to banks out of which, 18 were submitted to SBI, 3 applications to Syndicate Bank and 1 application to Canara Bank. (2 Trainees decided to apply at two banks).

The SBI Appraisal Team during their stay at Port Blair cleared (10 applications and issued sanction letters to the trainees. The remaining 7 applications have been processed by SBI and have been forwarded to their Calcutta Office for further processing which would take atleast 15 days.

Following are the interesting observations on the loan campaign organised at Port Blair:-

- (i) Manager(Credit), DIC, EDI Trainer and the team of SBI Officers, worked with complete co-ordination to clear maximum number of applications during their stay.
- (ii) Each trainee was individually interviewed by the appraisal team which found the trainees to be well aware of the details of their project report and its implications.
- (iii) SBI also sanctioned claim cash credit limit against the receipt of government subsidy so that the trainees do not have to come out initially with their equity as the subsidy is disbursed after creation of assets by the Union Territory.
- (iv) Some of the trainees were also given 'Clean medium term loan' as equity fund in order to reduce the margin money of the applicant.

The total sanction of 10 projects comes to approximately Rs.23.00 lacs and the total investment including margin money to be contributed by the applicant comes to Rs.25 lacs. Looking to the total sanction of loan in Andaman and Nicobar, the amount sanctioned during this period is subsequently higher.

5.0 Infrastructural Arrangement

During the visit of High Power Committee of IDBI and other Institutions, it was suggested to the Administration to construct necessary sheds in order to provide infrastructural facility in time. However, due to various problems at Administration, the shed construction had not taken place, and therefore, EDI Trainer had to look for alternate infrastructural arrangement with the help and support of trainees and other locals. However, the issue was brought to the notice of Committee of direction and necessary plans and arrangements have been suggested. The details are given in Page-9 of this report under the heading 'Meeting

of the Committee of Directors'. Out of 26 trainees have been able to identify land suitable to their project in the vicinity of Port Blair. 4 Trainees have been allotted land in the industrial estate and the Office of Director of Industries have assured to provide them necessary permits for cement assured to provide them necessary permits for cement and scarce raw-material in order to construct their sheds for the units. 4 trainees are likely to get small sheds in the municipal board estate. 4 of them are making arrangement in other islands viz., Rangat Bay, Middle Andaman & Nicobar. For the remaining trainees, necessary infra-structural facility is required to be arranged.

#### 6.0 Specific Arrangement

Based on the projects selected by the trainees, the following specific arrangements were provided in order to enable the trainees to start their unit:-

- (i) One of the trainees selected "Re-rolling Mill" as his project which is a banned item and therefore, SSI Registration Number could not be issued to him. However, the Office of Director of Industries with the recommendation of Development Commissioner, has approached Delhi administration for allowing SSI Registration Number as a special case as no such unit in this line exists there at present.
- (ii) One trainee who has selected confectionery as his project has been offered infrastructure on priority basis in the municipal area so that it satisfies Food and Drug Control Act.
- (iii) 4 projects have wood as basic raw-material which is not easily available in the island as all the wood is sold there through auction and therefore, it becomes difficult for small consumers to buy wood. The Lt. Governor was briefed about the situation who has agreed to

certain arrangement for the continuous supply of raw wood to these trainees. The Director of Industries had also suggested to form a group of these 4 trainees to get wood from the forest corporation for which he has assured them to provide the necessary help.

7.0 Meeting of the Committee of Direction

While formulating the proposal, it was suggested to form a Committee of Direction under the Chairmanship of Development Commissioner, Andaman and Nicobar Administration with Sr.Executives of SBI, EDII, IDEI and WEECON. In the first phase of the programme, the said Committee was formed and EDI trainer was in constant touch with the Committee members in order to obtain necessary support and advice for the successful conduction of the programme.

The formal meeting of the Committee of Direction took place on January 28, 1984 under the Chairmanship of Development Commissioner, A&N Administration and the following issues were discussed. The minutes of the meeting of Committee of Direction will be sent shortly.

- (i) The Committee felt that EDP should be made a permanent feature in the island and in light of the same, it would be necessary to create adequate infrastructural facility so that the trainees of future programmes will not suffer. For the trainees of this batch, the Development Commissioner requested the Dy. Commissioner to allot shed in the municipal estates on priority basis.
- (ii) Cases of trainees facing infrastructural problems were brought to the notice of the Chairman of the Committee who suggested the Director of Industries

to accommodate the trainees either in municipal board estate or allot land at other places. The Director of Industries assured his support and asked EDI Trainer to request his support and asked EDI trainer to request the trainees to identify suitable land and approach his office for allotment procedure.

(iii) The Committee also discussed the problems of obtaining raw-material and the Development Commissioner suggested the Director of Industries for making necessary arrangement through forest corporation for providing wood for wood-based units.

(iv) The case of re-rolling mills SSI Registration was also discussed and the Chairman of the Committee assured necessary follow-up at New Delhi for getting permission to issue SSI Registration Number.

(v) For follow-up work, the Committee decided to meet frequently so that necessary actions are taken to speed up the process of setting up the enterprises.

(vi) It was also decided to withdraw EDI trainer for about a month and then deputing him to Port Blair for necessary follow-up work so that trainees can be helped in getting machinery and in installation of machinery and such other requirements.

The next meeting of the Committee of Direction is likely to be scheduled in April 1984 to assess the progress and devise follow-up strategy.

8.0 Valedictory Function

The function was scheduled on January 28, 1984 with the valedictory address of Lt. Governor, Andaman & Nicobar Administration.

Very much motivated by the efforts of EDI trainers and support of other supporting agencies, the trainees hosted a dinner on the eve of the function and invited the Senior officials of Administration, support agencies and the faculty members.

In the valedictory function, Sr. Executive of EDI briefed about the Programme. General Manager (Operation), SBI, addressed the trainees and the Estimate Counsellors of Andaman and Nicobar gave words of advice to the trainers and thanked the supporting agencies particularly, IBBI, for supporting the programme and EDI for organising the same, in an excellent manner. The Valedictory address was given by Lt. Governor, A&N Administration who also distributed the sanction letters of the Bank to the trainees.

9.0 Conclusion

The Port Blair EDP commenced in the month of October 1983 and got completed on Jan. 27, 1984. With the help of supporting institutions and involvement of EDI trainers and

and core faculty, the programme trained 26 trainees out of which, 23 trainees have already prepared their project reports 20 loan applications were submitted out of which 11 got sanction from SBI (one sanction in principle).

3 trainees have already started their enterprises (i) Cane processing and cane carticles (ii) Soft drinks (iii) Automobile workshop. The Cane processing workshop was inaugurated on January 29, 1984 and the total project investment is Rs.9.16 lacs. The Automobile workshop was inaugurated on January 12, 1984.

A considered statement giving details of the trainees selected, trained, project report prepared etc. is enclosed as ANNEXURE-2.
