

Introduction

Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) play a significant role in the development of economies and thus have been rightly considered as the engine of the economic growth. It is the SME sector that provides a large number of employment opportunities and contributes significantly in export earnings, the world over. In Greater Mekong Sub-region (GMS) which comprises Cambodia, The People's Republic of China (Yunnan Province), Lao People's Democratic Republic, Myanmar, Thailand, and Vietnam, this sector contributes largely to the national economy in terms of total production, employment generation and utilization of regional resources. At the same time, it often confronts challenges and problems with increasing competitive environment.

It is in this regard, that Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India (EDI) conducted a regional workshop on 'Unleashing Entrepreneurship for Development and Trade' in association with Mekong Institute (MI), Thailand. The workshop was supported by Global Issues and Sustainable Development (GISD) Division of Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC), Switzerland and was organized at Bangkok during November 2006. About 30 senior officers representing the government sector, academia, trade, industry and media from Cambodia, Lao PDR, Thailand and Vietnam participated in the workshop. Encouraged by the success of the workshop and to reinforce earlier efforts, the Institute announces a project involving a series of similar such workshops in GMS countries, to be organized over the next two years. All these workshops are sponsored by GISD-SDC.

Project

Five such regional awareness workshops titled as 'Unleashing Entrepreneurship for Development and Trade' would be organized at the following places under this project.

The project also includes a research study to understand different dimensions of entrepreneurship and trade in the region, the findings of which would be appropriately and formally disseminated through a seminar.



Objectives

The overall objective of the project is to spread and strengthen the movement of entrepreneurship capacity building and international trade prevailing in GMS countries along with inter/intra regional trade cooperation.

The specific objectives are to:

- sensitize environment at macro level that would lead to creation of conducive environment for expanding entrepreneurial base and international trade in the region.
- 2. expand trade practices especially in the global market under prevailing WTO regime.
- 3. encourage and empower private sector to take up advocacy role and develop modalities for exchange of information on trade and exports



- 4. reinforce earlier efforts and disseminate information through need based research and seminar.
- 5. develop core centers in GMS region for sustainability of such initiatives.

Outcome

- Awareness generation at macro level for creating conducive environment for entrepreneurship and business development.
- Sensitization on capacity building needs of SME sector leading to effective utilization of resources and maximum impact of other interventions.
- 3. Identification of policy gaps and constraints, and thus, defining actions required for enhancing competitiveness of SME sector, specifically through policy interventions.
- Creation of better understanding of issues pertaining to trade negotiations, particularly under WTO regime, at national and international levels.



- 5. Increase in the share of GMS countries in the international market through exports.
- Common platform for taking up advocacy role for issues of common interest and exchanging information on trade and exports
- Institutionalization of such initiatives in core centers of GMS region leading to sustainability of the efforts.

Participation

The workshops are open to senior delegates representing private enterprises, government departments, industry associations, academia, professional institutions and media dealing with economic issues from GMS countries, namely, Cambodia, China (Yunnan Province), Lao PDR, Myanmar, Thailand and Vietnam. In each workshop, about 25 delegates will be invited out of which at least half the number would be from the host country while the rest would be from other countries.

Partners, Affiliates and Faculty Support

Mekong Institute (MI)

Mekong Institute (MI) is an independent GMS organisation chartered to provide specialised learning programmes for key public and private sector personnel in the areas of leadership, development and regional cooperation. It serves the countries of the Greater Mekong Sub-region: Cambodia, Lao P.D.R., Myanmar, Thailand, Vietnam and Yunnan Province of China. The mission of the institute is to contribute through human resource development and capacity building to accelerate sustainable economic and social development and poverty alleviation in the Greater Mekong Sub-region and promote regional cooperation and integration. MI had already partnered with EDI in the earlier workshop at Bangkok.

Mekong Institute will be the partner for implementing the project.

Lao-India Entrepreneurship Development Centre (LIEDC)

Vietnam Chamber of Commerce and Industry (VCCI)

The Vietnam Chamber of Commerce and Industry (VCCI) is a national organization, which assembles and represents business community, employers and business associations of all economic sectors in Vietnam to protect and assist business enterprises. It has a strong presence in most parts of the country.

VCCI will be the partner institute for EDI workshops at Hanoi and HO Chi Minh City, Vietnam.

VIEDC has been technically supported by EDI and has been involved in promoting entrepreneurship and strengthening SME sector in Vietnam actively for the last about three years.

Cambodia-India Entrepreneurship Development Centre(CIEDC)

The Cambodia-India Entrepreneurship Development Centre (CIEDC), Phnom Penh, was established under India-ASEAN project for promoting and strengthening SME sector in the country. CIEDC has been involved in important capacity building projects for the SME sector. Like LIEDC and VIEDC, this centre has also been technically supported by EDI.

South West China Investment Promotion Centre(SWCIPC)

South West China Investment Promotion Centre (SWCIPC), Kunming, a regional investment promotion organization, was set up in 1994 to carry out South West China Investment Promotion Programme. The Centre is involved in conducting investigations, negotiations, business promotion activities and economic and technical exhibitions for investment promotion.

SWCIPC would be the partner Institute for EDI workshop at Kunming, China.

Sponsoring Agency

Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC)

The Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC) is Switzerland's international cooperation agency within the Swiss Foreign Ministry. The institute has worked in/for about 70 countries in the world
