Ahmedabad: Around 150 to 200 technical colleges

Anil Sahasrabudhe, chairman of the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), who was in the city to attend a start-up seminar at the Gujarat Technological University on Wednesday said, "AICTE on an average gets applications to cancel permission for 150 to 200 technical colleges. The council also receives over 600 applications annually for starting new colleges in the country."

He added that there are many reasons for the closure of the technical institutes in the country. Sahasrabudhe said, "On an average, in 10,800 colleges in the country, a total of 1.5 lakh technical se-
