

EDI acknowledges the support extended by Shri R.M.Malla, Former President, EDI





Promoting Socially Responsible Business for Development in Asia and The Pacific

Increased entrepreneurial initiatives are seen as a panacea for promoting development. But for growth to be inclusive, it is important to combine it with an overriding inclination towards social causes. An all-encompassing growth model cannot bypass the underprivileged and hence it is important to impress upon corporations across the globe to look beyond profits and ensure that socially responsible business principles are practised. This will be a major contribution towards nation building.

In order to create such an awareness and imbibe the values of Corporate Social Responsibility among organizations, young business leaders, academicians and policy makers, UNESCAP Business Advisory

Council Task Force and EDI, jointly organized the International Workshop on 'Entrepreneurship in Socially Responsible Business for Development in Asia and The Pacific Region' and the 'Young Business Leaders Programme' during 16-18 October 2013 at EDI campus. The workshops were sponsored by the Industrial Development Bank of India Ltd. (IDBI Bank Ltd.) and Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI). 62 delegates from India, Laos, Myanmar, Uzbekistan, Nepal, Phillippines, Thailand, Denmark, Vietnam and Sri Lanka participated.

EDI. Chief Guest for the function was Dr. Y. K. Alagh, Chancellor, Central University of Gujarat. Also present on the occasion were Dr. Sailendra Narain, Head, UN-ESCAP Business Advisory Council Task Force on Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) and Entrepreneurship in Business and Development and former Chairman and Managing Director of SIDBI; Dr. Dinesh Awasthi, Director – EDI and Dr. Masato Abe, Economic Affairs Officer, UNESCAP.

The function began with the welcome address of Dr. Dinesh Awasthi. Dr. Awasthi established the significance of Socially Responsible Businesses in the present scenario and deliberated on how the concept must be promoted so that the baton is ably taken over by the younger generation.

Dr. Y. K. Alagh, in his address, said that this is the most opportune time to conduct a workshop on Socially Responsible Businesses and that legal and compulsory provisions must be made for companies to spend on Corporate Social Responsibilities, which is a segment of Socially Responsible Businesses. Dr. Alagh said that the TATAs is a classic example of this as it is owned by trusts and performs its responsibility of giving back to society/environment. He also expressed that businesses must introduce a concept that harnesses innovations and technology and links up small businesses with technology, market and innovation. Talking about sustainability, Dr. Alagh said that businesses must look at the environment and use it creatively for ensuring wide spread advantages. Dr. Alagh concluded with congratulations to the participants for resolving to understand and adopt the principles of socially responsible businesses.

Briefing the house about the overall objective of the programme, Dr. Sailendra Narain said that the idea is to boost the emergence and growth of socially responsible businesses for inclusive and sustainable development in Asia and the Pacific. The workshop, he said, aimed at sharing regional experiences in promotion of socially responsible businesses and the role of private sector including SMEs; assessing the facilitating and hindering factors in the emergence and growth of socially responsible businesses; sensitizing and enabling the private sector, including SMEs to envision and implement socially responsible business models and strategies. The most significant aspect of the workshop, informed Dr. Narain, was signing and adoption of the Ahmedabad Declaration and Action Plan for promoting SR Entrepreneurship in Business for inclusive and sustainable development

Over 16th and 17th October, the Workshop covered topical presentations followed by interactive discussions. The deliberations centered around the four pillars of socially responsible businesses, i.e.: corporate social responsibility; socially responsible environment; human rights and labour; and socially responsible business investments and business development services.

As a sequel to this workshop was the Young Business Leaders Programme which was inaugurated on EDI campus on 17th October by Mr. Piruz Khambatta, Chairman and Managing Director, Rasna Private Limited. Mr. N.K.Maini, Deputy Managing Director, SIDBI presided over the function. Discussing the objectives of the Young Business Leaders Programme.

Mr. Piruz Khambatta addressed potential and young businessmen and advised them to always have an eye for opportunities, be innovative and ethically right. He shared experiences and made suggestions on the ways of incorporating sustainability principles in their respective businesses, making socially responsible decisions, and applying them in business operations. Mr. Khambatta maintained that there is no dearth of opportunities in India, and that in every crisis there lay umpteen opportunities. He maintained that a potential entrepreneur must have a keen eye for opportunity so as to spot a viable and promising business opportunity. He also cited examples of several such first generation 'jugaadu' entrepreneurs, as he called them, who had spotted a crisis, took it as an opportunity and derived a solution which ultimately evolved into a flourishing business. He urged the youths to think beyond the obvious, reengineer their analytical capabilities to continuously scan the environment to spot a 'need-ofthe-hour' opportunity.

Mr. N. K. Maini talked about the seven business crises and advised young entrepreneurs on the ways of dealing with these and overcoming them. He believed

that crises must set off the response mechanism of entrepreneurs and they must put into action their well worked out crises management plan rather than shying away from them. He also gave a peek into the crises management strategy formulation and cited examples to explain how businesses had bounced back with a new lease of life with innovative, strategic

thinking. Mr. Maini believed that in order to kick start a new wave of entrepreneurship which does not consider that opportunities today are scant and is also not risk averse, the present generation will have to be encouraged to see the charms of the discipline and adopt it as a first career option. Talking about the significance of entrepreneurship, he highlighted how this discipline can create jobs, generate wealth, commercialize an invention, encourage innovations and lead to overall development. He encouraged potential entrepreneurs to adopt entrepreneurship and become the key drivers of the economy. Mr. Maini concluded with a briefing to the house on SIDBI's developmental schemes, projects and programmes.

Ms. Vanina Hinovska, UN-ESCAP Representative, proposed the Vote of Thanks. She expressed gratitude to the sponsors, the resource persons, participants, organizers and all involved in making the workshop a huge success.

Dr. Sailendra Narain looked forward to the program would resulting in the development of strategy formulating skills for young business leaders to promote socially responsible businesses and practices for sustainable development in Asia and The Pacific. He informed the audience that in a simulated business atmosphere, young leaders will interact with industry/experts and learn about incorporating sustainability principles in their respective businesses, making socially responsible decisions, and applying them in business operations.

In keeping with the objectives, the programme stimulated the thought process of participants who focussed discussions around topics such as –'How could the environment be sensitized to promote Socially Responsible businesses'; 'How could the ethics of Corporate Social Responsibility be enthused to make SRBs widespread'; 'How could human rights and labour relations' be

addressed in business to attain social progress' and 'How could a responsible business culture be floated by promoting socially responsible business investments and BDS'. The participants presented their action plans on concrete measures to be adopted to address the above.

The way the events unfolded over three days, one could well say that a *better* world was gradually unfolding.


University teaches Hindi, as one of the seven subjects, to its 'Arts' students. In order to further fine tune their skills and impart new ones, they associated with EDI to conduct a six-month course on Business Hindi for its students. It was expected that the programme will give a major boost to bilateral relations and substantially improve business cooperation. Thus, EDI prepared a tailor-made curriculum to teach Hindi to the 12 students who are on a visit to the Institute for the purpose. The programme commenced on 9th September, 2013 and will conclude on 7th March 2013.

The curriculum has especially been designed to impart indepth knowledge on Business Hindi and its effective usage in business, contemporary terminology in Business Hindi, Entrepreneurship and Women Entrepreneurship, and Indian Culture and Civilization to enable the participants to get to the root of the language and Indian culture.

Dr. Avadhesh Jha, Programme Director believes that it is a well designed curriculum giving a sharp edge to the participants, who he feels are grasping fast. He added that role plays, simulation exercises, knowledge on Hindi literature, advanced grammar, anecdotes and information of Indian culture make it an enriching course.

Chief Faculty, Dr. Sunil Shukla opined that, China had already started teaching Hindi in many of its universities like Beijing University and were now aiming at proficiency. These students, he added, look at a variety of job options after this training. Dr. Shukla expressed happiness over the fact that EDI was playing a big role in shaping not just the destiny of these students but also the trade relations of the two countries.

BIOTECHNOPRENEURS

in the making.....

echnological and advanced systems have suitably aided humans, since time immemorial, to bring their dreams to fruition. And, as we talk about advancement, progress and innovations, we can't help but mention the potential of Biotechnology. The society today is exploring the possibilities of using biotechnology, to the hilt, to transform itself into a forwardlooking, knowledge-driven economy. In order to widen the knowledge base in the area, and promote new enterprises in the Life Sciences Sector, the Institute initiated a 10-month Biotechnopreneur week-end Programme in 2011-12. This programme led to tangible outcome and was highly appreciated. The second batch of the programme was launched on 15th October, 2013 in an elaborate function at EDI. While the programme would be conducted by EDI, and Gujarat State Biotechnology Mission, it would be academically supported by esteemed knowledge partners like; Gujarat Venture Finance Ltd., Gujarat Industrial and Technical Consultancy Organization Ltd., Dr. Subodh Adeshara, Former Commissioner, Food and Drugs Control Administration; Centre for Innovation, Incubation and Entrepreneurship, IIM, Ahmedabad and Skyquest Technology Consulting Pvt. Ltd.

Present during the launch function were Dr. Dinesh Awasthi, Director-EDI; Dr. Anand Bhadalakar, Senior Sector Specialist, Gujarat State Biotechnology Mission, Govt. of Gujarat and Mr. Bipin Shah, Sr. Faculty-EDI & the Programme Director.

In his address Dr. Dinesh Awasthi, said that 'enterprise' and 'entrepreneurs' must be strengthened with innovation as the key focus area. Dr. Awasthi said that although innovation in India has started looking up, there are still gaps in this area and these need to be filled by promoting more focused interventions. Speaking about the significance of innovations, he pointed out that countries which innovate are on a fast growth track. He also added that advanced

countries like; USA have 1300 S&T incubators and 'coming up' countries like China and Korea have 800 and 400 incubators respectively. India with only 134 incubators must put in efforts to strengthen the area, added Dr. Awasthi. He concluded by urging the participants to make the most of this programme and set up technically advanced enterprises.

Briefing the house about the rationale behind the programme, Dr. Anand Bhadalakar, said that this is an effort to promote S&T enterprises. He expressed happiness over the fact that out of 14 participants of the last batch, 8 had already floated their enterprises and the remaining were in the process of setting up. He called the success rate encouraging and hoped for even appreciable success rate in the present batch.

In his address, Mr. Bipin Shah, said that this programme is likely to see more enterprises in the areas of biotechnology, pharmaceuticals, medical devices and other technology and innovation driven areas. He said that Biotechnology as a sector is emerging fast and so the need is to build capabilities of people to harness its potential. The second batch of

the Biotechnopreneur Programme has 12 selected participants from varied backgrounds such as; Pharmacy, Hospital and Healthcare Management, Banking and Finance, Biotechnology, Microbiology, Genetics, Industrial & Medical Biotechnology and Bio-medical Engineering. The main objective of the programme, is to train and guide the participants on selection of technologies, commercialization of the technology and aspects related to entrepreneurship. The programme, would also emphasize on practical and field related aspects such as; technology evaluation, business plan preparation, networking with institutions for financial resources and implementation. Besides week end class room training, the participants would also be counseled by advisors on a regular basis.

The programme is an innovative step in the direction of creating an inventive entrepreneurial society, that breaks free from conventional business opportunities and sets up businesses in emerging business areas. It's a major step and every small success will lead to development of a replicable model.

India Beckons.....

World over, countries wish to introduce entrepreneurship to its people for the kind of competencies and traits that are associated with it. Developing countries, brimming with challenges and opportunities, need entrepreneurs to comprehend such a situation, take productive actions and deliver results with multiplier effect.

Every year, EDI conducts programmes for professionals from developing countries on various aspects of entrepreneurship and small and medium enterprises. These are conducted with the sponsorship support of Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation, Ministry of External Affairs, Govt. of India.

The programmes conducted over the last few months:

Business Research Methodology & Data Analysis

While it is evident how SMEs, on account of their distinct advantages, reinvent global business standards and parameters, it is also apparent that they are not entirely able to leverage on their strategic advantages and competitive streak purely on account of lack of information related to markets, consumers and competitors.

Large corporates play their moves tactically as they hire world class consultants and are mentored by them but small businesses lack these services and hence are unable to pitch themselves advantageously. Business Research is vital for sustainability of small firms in the global economy. To grab opportunities that globalization offers, SMEs need information to support their decisions on target markets, product mix, branding, consumer perception, trends, supply and demand forecasting and quality control. Thus the programme, 'Business Research Methodology and Data Analysis', aimed at imparting knowledge on carrying out research within limited budget and their proficiency in selection of analytical tools and interpretation of statistical outcome on Market Segmentation, Brand Research, Consumer Analytics, Trends and Forecasting, Gap Analysis, Perceptual Mapping etc. This information will help SMEs understand and address their problems effectively.

The eight-week training programme organized during September 2–October 11, 2013 was attended by 42 participants from 26 countries. They comprised entrepreneurs, executives of SMEs, government officers, functionaries of non-government organizations, decision makers, consultants and academicians. The participants expressed confidence about improving the agility and dynamism of the small business sector on account of their enhanced skills in probing the problems, researching scientifically and subsequently analyzing the solutions in the context of region and industry. Dr. Jignasu Yagnik, Programme Director was of the opinion that, post this programme, the participants would certainly take the reins in their hands to make SMEs innovate, compete and contribute significantly in the world economy.

SME Banking & Financial Services

SMEs have drawn attention of policy makers, academicians, researchers and scholars as the core factor in the development of a nation. skills sets in all facets of Financial Intermediation to further the cause of development and growth of the SME sector, EDI conducted a 6-week training programme on 'SME Banking & Financial Services' during September 2 – October 11, 2013. The main objectives of the programme were to build capacity of organizations in SME related issues such as; Finance and Environment, to induce sustainable development in the SME sector, to facilitate lending innovation leading to promoting entrepreneurship and to help evolve a feasible frame work for development and growth of the SME sector in the country. 32 officials from Banks & Financial Institutions, Insurance Companies and Housing Finance Companies from 16 countries participated in this programme. The training programme helped the participants understand the overall Financial System, SME & Financial Services, Credit Analysis in Project & Working Capital Appraisal and Financial Services for SME Development. Mr. D.M. Parikh, the Programme Director said that the participants had understood the intensity and the complexity of SME Banking & Financial Services and the role that they could play in making the sector lookup.

Addressing Bottom of the Pyramid through Fostering Social Entrepreneurship/ Social Business

Social Entrepreneurship is a way of pursuing innovative solutions to social problems based on market-compliant business models. They, therefore, are as much a need of society as commercial entrepreneurs. With the objective of developing a cadre of social entrepreneurs, trainer-motivators, counselors and to sensitize policy makers to meet the challenges of poverty alleviation through sustainable social business ventures, a 6-week training programme on 'Addressing Bottom of the Pyramid through Fostering Social Entrepreneurship/Social Business' was conducted during September 2 — October 11, 2013. 23 participants from 16 countries participated in the programme. The participants were equipped with the basic understanding of tools and

techniques of promoting, developing and managing social enterprises. Also, they delved into areas, such as; Market Assessment & Identifying Social Business Opportunity and developing a Social Business Plan, Setting up and Managing Social Enterprise and Fund Raising for Social Enterprise. Dr. Dinesh Awasthi, the Programme Director felt that the concept of social entrepreneurship is on a rise for the last decade or so and referred to it as 'new dawn' on the front of social improvements. Dr. Awasthi felt that heralding these changes from the base of a market driven enterprise model is certainly an encouraging feat for the world. He appreciated the concern and the interest of the participants in the subject. Mr. Ajay Dixit, the Programme Coordinator, expressed happiness over the fact that the participants had gained knowledge and understanding of the concept, process and economics of social business ventures and hoped that they would use this knowledge to inspire new and innovative solutions to persistent social problems.

Managing Entrepreneurially...


Sustainable competitive advantage can only be achieved through constant skill honing and aligning of these skills with knowledge of business practices. This task isn't easy amidst challenges that corporates face today. It is important for professionals to wield skills that help convert challenges into opportunities. Promoting entrepreneurial management within an organization and grooming executives to arm themselves with winning entrepreneurial traits can establish a deep rooted culture of business triumphs.

With this objective, EDI conducted the International programme on Entrepreneurial Management during November 11 - December 20, 2013. Joint initiatives implemented under Cluster Development Initiatives could also help cluster firms go for value addition, product customization, brand building, improvement in marketing and export performance. This ensures their holistic development and contributes towards Local Economic Development (LED). Focussed efforts towards cluster development enhance competitiveness of the cluster MSMEs and make them stand tall in the globalized economy. Cluster Development Executives can streamline development initiative in the desired manner and also ensure sustainability of progress ensured.

The International Programme conducted during November 11 - December 20, 2013, for Cluster Development Executives aimed at creating a cadre of CDEs by improving knowledge and skills of participants so as to enable them to successfully implement a Cluster Development Programme. 35 participants from 21 countries participated in the programme. The participants were given a complete understanding of clusters and their dynamics, besides familiarizing them with the nuances of successfully implementing a Cluster Development Programme.

Programme Director, Mr. Sanjay Pal said that the programme focused on cluster development perspective in both developed and developing countries, thus reinforcing best practices. Listing the areas focused upon, he said that, dynamics of MSMEs working in clusters, role of trust building and CDEs, consortium approach for ensuring holistic business performance, role of business development services (BDS), private-public-partnership (PPP) mode in developing common facility centres (CFC) and improving global competitiveness of the cluster firms/MSMEs were covered in details and added to the perspectives of the participants."

The participants appreciated the programme as an effective platform which endorsed the significance of

their work and groomed them into change agents. Their action plans indicated that they had developed insights into facilitating overall development of the local economy which would in turn help in poverty eradication, employment creation, income generation and local economic development (LED).

Nurturing Aspirations.....

Entrepreneur Trainer-Motivators (ETMs) are the architects of an entrepreneurial economy. The participants were also oriented to the significance of sensitizing the environment for extending timely assistance and support required for establishment of small business ventures.

Mr. S. B. Sareen, Programme Director stated, "The training programme would go a long way in creating new world entrepreneurs who would trust their abilities to succeed and not rely on support services or concessions. And, in all this, these Entrepreneur Trainer-Motivators would play a major role." He added that the participants had gained in depth knowledge and that they would be able to successfully help potential entrepreneurs turn their ideas into action.

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

Turning Around Their Lives for a Better Future

While development plans need to be put in place, it is also important to ensure that the vulnerable groups are suitably compensated through a rewarding resettlement plan. TATA Sponge Iron Ltd. (TSIL), a joint

venture of TATA Steel and IPICOL for production of sponge iron, has been allocated mines by Ministry of Coal, Govt. of India at Radhikapur (East) coal block in Angul District, Odisha. However, in the proposed coal block, a total number of five villages are going to be displaced. Hence, one of the top priorities of the company was to ensure peaceful Rehabilitation and Resettlement of the affected families at Angul District in Odisha. EDI was, therefore, roped into design and implement a rehabilitation and Resettlement plan which was inclusive, sustainable and ensured a better quality of life.

The approach primarily put in place a grievance redressal cell so that the affected families could be counseled and convinced about the result-orientedness and positive impact of the rehabilitation plan. This also established an instant connect with the affected families. It was especially ensured that the weaker and marginalized sections were adequately protected. Simultaneously, corporate social responsibility initiatives were flagged to ensure enhanced employability, prosperity and peace for the affected families.

In keeping with the objectives set before itself, the project has partnered with community leaders, opinion makers and other stakeholders like NGOs so that the locals can connect better with them and be sensitized about the benefits of the resettlement and rehabilitation plan. As a strategy towards developing necessary infrastructure at the Rehabilitation colonies, necessary steps will also be undertaken in the coming times, in coordination with district administration, so that the families get all requisite facilities. Formation of a joint monitoring committee is in the process to ensure quality standards of construction to be undertaken.

Special focus will be placed on youth, women, senior citizens and children with concrete measures to impart quality education from elementary to higher level, ensure good health care measures, increase employability of the youth, systematize welfare activities like geriatric care, crèche centres, family counseling centres, drug de-addiction centres etc. Additionally, a vocational training centre will be set up in the rehabilitation colony catering to the needs of potential women entrepreneurs by imparting them skills in areas such as; tailoring, agarbatti making, soap making, candle making etc.

The uniqueness of the project lies in bringing 'rehabilitation and resettlement plans' and 'CSR initiatives' under one umbrella for holistic and sustainable development. The project commenced from June 2013 and has already recorded notable milestones.

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

Business Conclave

VIith a view to creating awareness on skill and cluster development and modern marketing & technology practices, Department of Micro & Small Scale Enterprises and Textiles, Govt. of West Bengal organized Synergy MSME- 2013 Business Conclave in Kolkata during 16 – 21 September, 2013. EDI was invited by the Govt. of West Bengal to participate in this conclave and run a Cluster Development Clinic so that the problems of existing clusters could be diagnosed, their potential gauged and solutions could be provided on putting these on a high growth trajectory. EDI's Cluster Development Clinic received overwhelming response with around 800 people visiting it and more than 300 queries getting resolved successfully. Entrepreneurs from different clusters such as; honey bee, roofing tiles, ceiling fans, red bricks etc expressed great satisfaction over the response that they received from EDI experts on technology, product and market related hiccups. Apart from this, EDI also addressed a forum of General Manager - District Industries Centre (GM-DIC) on the modern technical processes used by some of the clusters in Gujarat and other parts of the nation.

BMO Capacity Building and Handholding Services

Business Management Organizations act as key intermediaries between the public and private sector. They are central to the economic development of a country. BMOs can be a platform for promoting a better investment climate in developing economies. In order to be a strong and reputable representative of the private sector, BMOs should have the capacity to advocate the interests and concerns of their members; become strong organizations with a proper governance structure and respond to their members' needs by delivering required services and information.

BMOs can promote SME growth through facilitation and/or direct provisioning of demand-driven services and through advocacy aimed at creating a better business environment. Because of their membership nature and mandate, BMOs can represent and voice the concerns of their members at the policy level, creating a platform for change that can lead to sustainable, bottom-up policy reforms.

So, the need of the hour is that they move beyond the advocacy role and provide market - driven value added services to their members. The most important areas for intervention for a BMO should be facilitation and provisioning of business development services (BDS) which can directly improve the competitiveness of SMEs generally operating in clusters. In order to ensure this, EDI has been conducting Capacity Building Programmes for BMOs. However, a step further, the Institute brainstormed on sustaining the changes brought about as a result of these programmes. It, therefore, initiated an effort to provide continuous handholding support under 'Post Training Support Activities' so that BMOs could continue matching their learning, and thus services, with the changing market assumptions and upheavals. 7 BMOs located in the Western and Eastern parts of the country have been identified in the first phase. Training and counseling

sessions would be conducted to strengthen their secretariat and service portfolio. It would also be ensured that they implement standard business model for delivery of different services, as well as update their capacity to partner with the Government in implementation of public support schemes and programmes. These programmes are being conducted with the support of SEQUA, GIZ. The specific objectives of the assignment are to:

- support the assigned 7 BMO's in preparing an Action Plan for taking up activities till Jan 2014 and support the assigned first pilot BMOs in reviewing their already prepared business plans.
- provide consultancy support to the assigned BMOs in implementation of activities as per time lines.

The assignment will include providing consultancy support to the assigned BMOs through a combination of consultants possessing expertise in the area of BMO activities and subject matter experts to achieve:

- Preparation of Action Plans by BMOs
- Planning and Implementation of activities by BMOs as per their action plan keeping in view the results specified under the "Scope of Work".

- Documentation of Case studies.
- Detailed report covering the methodology, implementation, achievements, challenges / constraints, impact etc.

The programme would, therefore, render industry associations, involved in MSME clusters, capable of undertaking competitive as well as socially, environmentally and economically relevant initiatives.

EDI Appointed as Project Management Consultant

The Directorate of Micro & Small Scale Enterprises, Government of West Bengal has appointed EDI as a Project Management Consultant (PMC) for developing MSME clusters in the State. As PMC, EDI will work as a think tank for cluster development in the State of West Bengal and spearhead MSME cluster development on a turn-key basis i.e., from

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concept to completion. Starting with identification and selection of MSME clusters, EDI will conduct diagnostic study, prepare an action plan for identified clusters, implement soft skill interventions, prepare detailed project report and implement hard skill interventions. The cluster development activities in the State will be primarily managed as per Micro and Small Enterprise-Cluster Development Programme (MSE-CDP) guidelines. Apart from designing and implementing activities, EDI will also prepare proposals for

securing funding support so as to ensure continuity of development activities for promotion of MSME clusters in the State.

On the same line, the Directorate of Industry, Government of Orissa also empaneled EDI as a Resource Agency to spearhead MSME cluster development in the State. To start with, the Government of Orissa has allotted three MSME clusters to EDI. More such clusters will be added in the portfolio of EDI.

Harnessing the Potential of Technology in Entrepreneurship . . .

Leveraging new technologies and innovations to enhance the prospects of business is on the rise as entrepreneurs of today understand that these factors are dynamic and cannot be alienated from business if one has to make a conspicuous mark. Every entrepreneur who envisions growth ambitiously has to accept this reality. Scientists and technologists possess an inventive bent of mind towards innovations and novel techniques and are, therefore, unparalleled human resource for a country and must be given the right opportunities to convert their pioneering ideas into entrepreneurial reality.

Thus, in order that many high tech and high end projects see the light of the day and brighten the economy's prospects in the long run, there is a need to orient scientists of research laboratories and other R&D institutions to the finer concepts and nuances of entrepreneurship. With this goal in focus, EDI organized a 5-day national training programme on Entrepreneurship Development & Management for

scientists & technologists. The programme, third in the series, commenced from 9th December, 2013 at EDI. 23 scientists / technologists working in government departments, ministries of central government and public sector units participated from various states such as; Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Kerala, Odisha, Uttar Pradesh, Delhi, Andhra Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Haryana and Tamil Nadu. The programme was sponsored by Department of Science & Technology, Govt. of India, New Delhi.

Besides inputs on establishing and managing an enterprise, areas such as; business opportunity identification, business plan preparation, information on various schemes of assistance were also comprehensively delved into in the programme. Mr. Prakash Solanki, Programme Director endorsing the significance of the programme said that, down the line, a strong entrepreneurial cadre of scientists and technologists would be created and they would prominently change the landscape of business. He

added that this is a ground-breaking programme which will deliver notable results in the years to come.

Thus, it can well be seen that a huge market awaits these techies and a colossal world of innovations and technologically progressive enterprises is likely to bring the business landscape in its fold.

Meghalaya Gears Up to Promote New Enterprises in Upcoming Areas

North Eastern regions have always been a concern when it comes to implementing development related activities. The uneven mountain terrain, infrastructural constraints and lack of essential services inhibit growth and implementation of development interventions. It has been seen that Entrepreneurship is understood in a very limited sense in the hilly regions, with minuscule efforts going into enterprise development as compared to similar such efforts at a macro level. One reason that can be attributed to this limited entrepreneurial growth is the lack of training, support services, linkages, technology and market.

Against this backdrop, EDI has signed an MoU with State Institute of Rural Development (SIRD), Meghalaya, to impart training to 10000 potential entrepreneurs of the

region. The trained youths will be equipped with knowledge, skills and attitude to set up their own ventures and brave the challenges related to entrepreneurship. The idea is to develop in them the mindset to achieve through proper training and counseling.

In order to maximize the impact of training the trainees will be exposed to business opportunities, viable in their vicinity. This will ensure a boost to indigenous entrepreneurship. To achieve this, in addition to training and counseling, the Institute will, in association with SIRD, undertake a survey of the local opportunities for enterprise creation. Based on this a master plan would be readied and the trainees would be trained to succeed in pre-identified areas.

In order to maximize reach and impact, EDI will train and ready a cadre of resource persons so that they can reach the grassroots with ease and without any language bar. Another significant objective that EDI seeks to achieve by developing a cadre of resource persons is to ensure sustainability of the initiative after EDI's exit.

The outcome of this initiative would be well groomed, trained and skilled group of young entrepreneurs who would not just be economically stable but also serve as panacea for the region's growing unemployment problem.

With a view to review and follow-up the objectives and achievements of MoU, an 11-member delegation led by Shri K.N.Kumar, IAS, Principal Secretary, Community and Rural Development Department, Govt. of Meghalaya visited EDI during 17-20 November, 2013.

All about Scaling up BUSINESSES

DI, in association with CII, organized an interactive session on 'Scaling Up Businesses'. The Key note speaker for the session was Mr. Subroto Bagchi, Chairman, Mindtree Ltd. Interacting with the PGP students, Mr. Bagchi advised them to primarily think big, plan and then take a step-by-step approach to growth. He shared instances where focused strategy had led to multidimensional growth.

Also, he talked about six principles to be considered while doing business. These he listed as;

- Power of Content
- Change
- Business Model and Customer
- Reputation in the form of Capital
- Assessment of Adversity and the potential market

He added that each business has its own set of problems which should be diagnosed, analyzed and a focused strategy must be developed to address the concern. Some tips that he suggested for sustained growth of a business were:

- Board of Members must be experienced enough to be able to make tangible contribution by way of proper advise and direction
- Diversification plans must constantly be explored with new business models and target markets.
- Entrepreneurs must constantly seek to enhance skills for self development and for the benefit of their business.

Students were happy to be a part of an insightful lecture on nurturing a business and learning about the relevance of Indian entrepreneurship as against the global industrial scenario.

Science and Technology to Drive Change

With the declaration of 2010-20 as the "Decade of Innovation", the Government stressed on the need to pronounce a policy to synergize science, technology & innovation. The National Innovation Council was also established to impart a distinct direction to initiatives.

The Science, Technology & Innovation (STI) Policy 2013, thus formulated, was unveiled by the Honourable Prime Minister of India. The policy seeks to bring about fresh perspectives to the scientific-technological and delivery community in the private, public and NGO domains to ensure sustainable, inclusive and holistic development. The policy outlines several principles so as to strengthen the National Innovation System in this decade of innovations. However, prior to its implementation, it was thought prudent to elicit views from a broad cross-section of stakeholders to ensure holistic and comprehensive coverage of the policy. A brainstorming workshop was, therefore, organized by

ED, with sponsorship support of NSTEDB, Department of Science & Technology, Govt. of India, to bring stakeholders on a common platform for rich deliberations.

The workshop identified best practices and came up with new ideas in the areas of research, technology and innovation to help frame specific schemes, missions, programmes, mechanisms, instruments and procedures for implementation of the Policy. A diverse section of stakeholders: scientists, technocrats, professionals from industry, business, Government, civil society etc., who participated in the workshop, made significant contributions.

Workshop Director, Mr. S. B. Sareen, enunciated on the need to evolve newer mechanisms to promote excellence and relevance of science and technology in varied sectors so that the benefits could be pervasive and envelope all sections of society.

Shri A. K. Saxena placed accent on the point that the contribution of Science & Technology has to be phenomenal for a country to register impressive industrial growth. He maintained that a country with unique innovation capacity and orientation always progresses rapidly and can easily address critical development challenges. People of Gujarat, the Chief Guest stressed, have a natural entrepreneurial bent of mind which, he said, they must harness to make use of the immense opportunities in science and technology field.

Articulating the significance of the discipline of

science and technology, Dr. Neeraj Sharma stated that if approached ingeniously, science and technology could introduce sustainable benefits for people from varied sections of society. The Workshop, he informed, was an attempt to assimilate views so as to study the feedback and come out with a policy which was all-embracing, comprehensive and beneficial to society at large.

Entrepreneurship Development in Mauritius

EDI signed an MoU with the Govt. of Mauritius to set up Entrepreneurship Development Center in Mauritius to set off entrepreneurial initiatives in the country. This initiative will further strengthen bilateral relations between India and Mauritius with EDI helping Mauritius in developing its SMEs and MSMEs, lending technical support to build strong cooperatives, setting up and reviving clusters, handicraft sector and incubators. The idea is also to target students through skill building training in entrepreneurship. Mr. Jangbahadoor Singh Seetaram, Hon'ble Minister of Business, Enterprise and Cooperatives of Mauritius said, "To sustain any external shock and to have permanent, strong SME and MSME sectors, we need to develop our local market. EDI will help us become adept in it...it will teach us how to innovate and nurture our enterprises.

Chinese Delegation visits EDI





Steering Development that's Inclusive



Having tried conventional career options like arts, teaching and law, Satya finally realized that these were not his areas of interest and that he was keen to do something different..... something that could impact millions of lives. Social sector beckoned him and responding to his inner voice he embarked his journey in the social sector. He joined EDI's Post Graduate Diploma in Management of NGOs (PGDMN) in 2000-01 to gain knowledge on the sector and as he puts it, "so that I could initiate my career on the premise of knowledge and not solely on my inclinations and instinct. And, I was proved right." After the course Satya gained hands-on experience before venturing out. Thus, working with organisations like the World Vision India, Shramik Bharti, Rural Development Institute of the Himalayan Institute Hospital Trust,



Emmanuel Hospital Association, Oneworld South Asia, he toiled for ten years in varied social development areas comprising microfinance and information & communication technology for health care.

An urge to do something meaningful for the society ultimately led Satya to set up Shikhar Development Foundation (SDF) in September 2007 and offer micro-credit and micro insurance (life) services in the National Capital Region (NCR) of Delhi. He also managed 'Sewa Ashram', which aimed to rehabilitate the poor and destitute in the NCR. Manpower, financial resources, poor regulation in the microfinance sector and high cost of operation were the major challenges to be overcome. To meet the additional resources required for scaling operations, Satya floated Partners of Shikhar Trust (POST), an investment vehicle; to invite investment from likeminded development oriented individuals with an aim of promoting microfinance activities. Satya also planned to secure funds by approaching angel investors, venture capitalists and investment banks. He

acquired Anup Leasing Pvt. Ltd (ALPL) and renamed it as 'Shikhar Finance & Development Services (P) Ltd' (SFDSL).

Having offered rehabilitation services to 3000 destitute and microfinance services to 10,000 families in the NCR, Satya planned to transfer all the microfinance activities of SDF to SFDSL and in


addition to micro credit and micro insurance, offer investment and housing finance products through SFDSL. Satya envisions SDF as a national level institution offering innovative skill development programmes for empowerment of the underprivileged and plans to open five branches of 'Sewa Ashram' in Delhi.

Living Life on His Terms

Inlike his peers interested in working for big brands, Prashant Hiralal Sachdev, a Pune based computer engineer was keen to become an entrepreneur. Rather than joining his family business of trading agricultural commodities, he desired to start on his own in the IT sector. He yearned to create a product based business like Microsoft, Google rather than the IT service businesses such as; Infosys and Wipro. But sensing a strong need of gaining relevant work experience at a small yet innovative product based company before venturing, Prashant went for a six months training in 'embedded systems' at Micromax, Mumbai and later also gained rich exposure while working for three years at Kenati Technologies Pvt. Ltd, Pune.

To satisfy his appetite for entrepreneurial knowledge, Prashant enrolled for EDI's Post Graduate Diploma in Business Entrepreneurship and Management (PGDBEM) in 2006-07 and later at the Babson College, U.S.A. During his stint with EDI, he created his first business plan involving a metadata stream parallel to the video stream to facilitate television news viewers in watching their desired news stories. At Babson, Prashant reformed his original business plan to offer metadata solutions for online videos and thereby add value to the existing online video experiences of the end users. Prashant calls his decision of joining EDI as well timed and immensely useful in concretizing his dream of becoming an entrepreneur. He believes that EDI gave him the right





knowledge, skills and attitude to succeed as an entrepreneur.

Roping in Nilesh Daine, one of his seniors at Kenati, Prashant launched Onion Technologies Pvt. Ltd. in December 2008. Onion Technologies aimed to emerge as a niche metadata player in videos, beginning with offering the best metadata solutions to online video platform companies, thereby saving the latter's time as well as efforts. Retaining its focus on the metadata in videos, Onion Technologies extends from online videos to various other platforms like settop boxes, mobiles and each such embedded device where consumers watch videos. Prashant's dream is to nurture Onion Technologies into a leading product based company enhancing end user experiences through rich metadata solutions for premium online, offline (downloaded) and television videos.

But the biggest challenge for Onion Technologies is to attract the 'right customers' for shaping up its offerings and identifying a business model which aligned well with its long term vision! Prashant is taking it all in his stride, living his dream and moving up each day.

EDI, the only Institute from the central region in 'AICTE-CII Best Industry Linked Technical Institute in India 2013' survey report

EDI has featured as the only established management institute from the Central Region in 'AICTE-CII best industry linked technical institute in India 2013 survey report'. All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) and Confederation of Indian Industry jointly conducted a survey of Industry-Linked Technical Institutes 2013 to determine industry-academia alignment on different parameters such as; Faculty, Placement, Curriculum, Research and Consultation, Governance and Infrastructure. The survey was conducted in various disciplines such as; Engineering, Management, Architecture and Pharmacy.

1050 institutions participated in this survey out of which, in the final round 37 institutes qualified for a jury member visit where EDI not only qualified as one of the shortlisted Institutes but also featured as the only established Management Institute from the central region.

In 2012, the focus was only on engineering institutes approved by AICTE in six basic subject streams i.e. Mechanical, Civil, Electronics and Communications, Computer and IT, Electrical and Chemical. This year, the scope was substantially expanded to include all streams of engineering and also the disciplines of management, pharmacy and architecture. Survey was online and the first level of basic scores were calculated through algorithms set after consultation and brainstorming with industry and academic experts.



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
