
Till date the camps have groomed 465 students from across the country. The Institute now announces its **15th National Summer Camp on Entrepreneurial Adventures for Youth.**

MAIN OBJECTIVE :

Youths develop unique strengths as the camp enables them to realize their hidden potential and develops their capabilities to meet the challenges ahead by fostering entrepreneurial traits among them.

ACTIVITIES:

- Entrepreneurial motivation development games and exercises to foster traits such as creativity, concern for excellence, leadership, problem solving, independence, goal-setting, etc.
- Formal and informal interaction with successful achievers and entrepreneurs.
- Evaluation and development of entrepreneurial traits and competencies.
- Visits to institutions of repute to analyse the process of creation and development.
- Self assessment through specifically designed psychological tests, instruments and camera presentation on self.
- Career and psychological counselling.



FACULTY:

Behavioural scientists, Developmental psychologists and Entrepreneurship educationists form a part of the faculty group. The core group comprises:

- Dr. Anupriya Pandey, an expert in managerial economics and finance. Currently involved in reviewing EDP model and formulating an appropriate EDP model for conducting result-oriented EDPs.

DURATION, VENUE AND ACCOMMODATION:

EDI has been spearheading entrepreneurship movement throughout the nation with a belief that entrepreneurs need not necessarily be born but can be developed through wellconceived and well-directed activities.


Under the thrust area, Entrepreneurship Education, EDI has been progressively focussing on the development of its academic programmes to disseminate the essence of the Institute's professional knowledge-base amongst entrepreneurs of tomorrow. Some of EDI's other core activities under this thrust are Summer Camps for Children, Faculty Development Programmes, Researches and long term academic programmes which include Post-Graduate Diploma in Business Entrepreneurship and Management and Post-Graduate Diploma in Management of NGOs.

In addition to the present 'Youth Camp' as of now, the Institute has trained 465 children in its 12 Summer Camps on Entrepreneurial Simulation for Children at Ahmedabad. In view of EDI's expertise in Entrepreneurship, Gujarat Textbook Board assigned to it the task of developing texbooks on Entrepreneurship for 11th and 12th standards. University Grants Commission had also assigned to EDI, the task of developing curriculum on entrepreneurship.

The institute has earned a great deal of national and international reputation by way of its entrepreneurship development efforts. UN (ESCAP) has deceased it as a 'Centre of Excellence' on account of its International Achievements. Recently, the Institute has been entrusted with the task of setting up Entrepreneurship Development Centres in four South East Asian countries, namely; Cambodia, Lao-PDR, Myanmar and Vietnam.
