THE INSTITUTE

An acknowledged National Resource Institute for Entrepreneurship education, research & training

The Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India (EDI), an autonomous and not-for-profit Institute, set up in 1983, is sponsored by apex financial institutions - IDBI, IFCI Ltd., ICICI Ltd. and State Bank of India (SBI). The Government of Gujarat pledged twenty-three acres of land on which stands the majestic and sprawling EDI campus.

The Institute offers state-of-the-art courses of one-year duration: **Post Graduate Diploma in Business Entrepreneurship & Management (PGDBEM)** and **Post Graduate Diploma in Management of NGOs (PGDMN)**. It has successfully completed eight batches, through which around 661 students have been trained and groomed to meet the challenges of the entrepreneurial world and social sector.

To pursue its mission further, EDI has helped set up fourteen state-level exclusive entrepreneurship development centers and institutes. One of the more satisfying achievements, however, was taking entrepreneurship to a large number of schools, colleges, science and technology institutions and management schools in several states by including entrepreneurship inputs in their curricula. In view of EDI's expertise in Entrepreneurship, the University Grants Commission had also assigned EDI the task of developing curriculum on Entrepreneurship, and Gujarat Textbook Board assigned to it the task of developing textbooks on Entrepreneurship for 11th & 12th standards.

In order to broaden the frontiers of Entrepreneurship Research, EDI has established a Center for Research in Entrepreneurship Education and Development (CREED), to investigate into a range of issues surrounding small and medium enterprise sector, and establish a network of researchers and trainers by organising a biennial seminar on Entrepreneurship Education and Research.

These successes and commitments have culminated in the recognition of its achievements by the Government of India and various State Governments. In the international arena, efforts to develop entrepreneurship by way of sharing resources and organising training programmes, have helped EDI earn accolades and support from the World Bank, Commonwealth Secretariat, UNIDO, ILO, FNSt, British Council, Ford Foundation, European Union and several other renowned agencies.

The Ministry of External Affairs assigned project of setting up Entrepreneurship Development Centers in Cambodia, Lao PDR, Myanmar and Vietnam is progressing in full swing. While the already commissioned centres at Lao PDR and Combodia have started reaping rewards, the centres at other countries will also be established in a short span of time.

In recognition of its international achievements, the United Nations Economic & Social Commission for Asia and Pacific (UN-ESCAP), Bangkok, Thailand, has declared EDI as a **'Center of Excellence'**.

PROJECT WORK/INTERNSHIP PLACEMENT

The Project work/Internship programme aims to broaden the perspective of the students by providing them with an opportunity to blend real life experience in a development organization with the theories learnt in classrooms. The internship component provides opportunities to understand various aspects of the organization and also gives the organization a scope to know

and obtain an independent assessment of a programme or a process. This internship programme is for a period of 5 weeks. At the end of the project the students prepare a thesis/report on their findings. The formal sharing of this thesis is done with a panel that includes academicians and practitioners, and is graded. The students are expected to provide a copy of their report to the host organisation. Preliminary findings are also shared towards the end of the project work period in a formal session organized by the host NGO. A large number of students, while on internship, receive advance offers, i.e., before final placement, on the basis of their quality of work during internship assignments with the organization.

PEDAGOGY

The interactive nature of learning experience distinguishes EDI from many other institutions. The emphasis is on action learning. Business games, computer simulation, live projects, role plays, case-based teachings, field work and group work combine to create a challenging environment to define problems and find workable solutions.

Teaching and guidance are principally provided by EDI Faculty and selectively supported by a host of experts from leading educational institutions and NGO leaders.

QUALIFICATION CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION

A bachelor's degree in any discipline is essential for admission to Post Graduate Diploma Programme. The students for the course are enrolled on the basis of a written test and personal interview. The objective of the selection procedure is to gauge their attitude and commitment towards the social development sector.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

The nature of opportunities for PGDMN graduates is seen in a range that extends from service delivery to community development, to organizing communities for change and organizing training programme for capacity building for local groups, government officials or for other specialized groups. They are today involved in providing policy inputs at various levels of decision-making within government agencies, advocacy work for the disadvantaged sections and documentation of development activities. The course trains students for development work in areas such as; natural resource management, gender human rights, education, health, micro enterprise development & livelihood promotion etc. Students from the past eight batches are involved with agencies working at the grassroots to that of multilateral agencies.

PLACEMENT

The campus placements have witnessed ever increasing and encouraging responses from NGOs. Our students are working with NGOs spread across the entire country. The NGOs who have recruited our students include: ARAVALI (Rajasthan), Aga Khan Rural Support Program, Blind Peoples Association, SEWA, Indian Institute of Rural Development, Kutch Mahila Vikas Sangathan, Projects of World Health Organisation, PRAVAH, Don Bosco Development Office-Mumbai, UTTHAN, Times Foundation, Give Foundation and many others. Students joining these organizations have found offers at the middle management level and many of them have grown within the organization/sector in due course of time. A few of the NGO Management students are also serving in international territories on humanitarian projects.


