We have been devoting great efforts to this research in order to present a unique and holistic entrepreneurship scenario to all stakeholders so that a yet more stronger ecosystem could be built.

Let me state that the Global Entrepreneurship Monitor (GEM) Survey is the largest annual study of entrepreneurial dynamics in the world. The study is venerated for its credibility and coverage of research. With the Indian Entrepreneurial Eco-system becoming robust by the day, the GEM-India Consortium is assuming a major role in probing the rapidly evolving nature and the level of entrepreneurship in India. The GEM-India Consortium is also spreading its wings to involve regional and state level entrepreneurship institutions to ensure maximum reach in researching the multiple dimensions of Indian entrepreneurship. EDII is honoured to lead the India chapter of the GEM survey and considers this a unique opportunity to draw out strategic deliberation points leading to a forward-looking entrepreneurial ecosystem in the country.

The Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India has set global standards already. Please tell us about EDII's international presence. What are the major international projects that you look forward to?

EDII is associated with various international entities to foster entrepreneurship growth across the world.

The Institute has been empanelled by the Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation (ITEC), Ministry of External Affairs, Govt. of India and has been hand-holding several development countries by training their professionals in the areas of entrepreneurship and investment promotion. EDII seeks to give an entrepreneurial routing to several countries across the globe by capacity-building.

So far, 4043 professionals from across the world have been groomed as part of 135 international capacity building training programmes conducted under sponsorship support of ITEC Division of the Ministry of External Affairs.

EDII evolved 'Concept-to-Completion' approach for setting up Entrepreneurship Development Centres across the developing world. The Institute has established EDII-like institutions in Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar, Vietnam, Uzbekistan and Rwanda. Centres in some African countries and Bhutan are underway.
