THE PROGRAMME

India, like other developing countries, is confronted with the serious problem of mounting unemployment among educated youth. In order to deal with this problem, Entrepreneurship Development Programmes (EDPs) have been found as an effective tool to motivate new-comers for taking up self-employment and entrepreneurial career. It has also been realized by Indian planners that entrepreneurial values should be inculcated when the students are graduating to make them aware of Entrepreneurship as a possible career opportunity. Further, it may help convert creative energies, technical and scientific capabilities into productive resources, generate further employment, output and income.

To meet with the above objective, Department of Science & Technology (DST) has taken the initiative in introducing entrepreneurship as a course in Science and Technical Institutions. DST has also assisted a number of engineering colleges and polytechnics in creating Entrepreneurship Development Cells for organizing ED activities in their colleges and nearby areas. However, for effective introduction of entrepreneurship as a course or conducting EDPs in technical institutions, it is important to develop human resources - teacher - trainers on the subject. This will help in effectively organizing, monitoring, controlling and imparting entrepreneurship values among students. Keeping the human resources development in entrepreneurship in mind, Department of Science & Technology (Govt. of India), IDBI, IFCI & ICICI have sponsored a training programme for teachers from technical institutions to be conducted by EDI.

OBJECTIVES

- * To develop the teachers' skills, knowledge and resources for effective initiation of entrepreneurship awareness camps and entrepreneurship orientation courses in Engineering/Science Colleges and Polytechnics.
- * To expose the teachers to the comprehensive entrepreneurship development process and equip them to coordinate/organize entrepreneurship development courses in the colleges.
- * To enable teachers to competently guide and counsel students towards entrepreneurial career.

PROGRAMME CONTENT

In order to fulfil the above objectives, EDI has formulated a need-based training programme. This will enable teachers/ professors to develop their skills in preparing, planning and implementing Entrepreneurship Development Programmes.

The contents of the programme may be broadly classified into the following areas:

- * Composition and process of successful Entrepreneurship Development Programmes: Model and strategies, developmental inputs, identification and selection of entrepreneurs, monitoring and follow-up.
- * Skills and Behavioral Training Inputs: Achievement Motivation and Extension Motivation, Problem-solving, Decision-making, etc.

* Resource-building and knowledge-based inputs, procedures required for setting up of enterprise, incentives and benefits available to new entrepreneurs, causes for sickness in small scale industries, training material and methodology, etc.

* Experience of EDPs conducted in the State and specific needs /problems in promoting S&T students.

FACULTY

Faculty for the programme will include experienced faculty team of EDI-I and resource persons and experts from National and State level financial institutions, Technical Consultancy Organizations, University Departments, Department of Science & Technology, etc.

VENUE AND DURATION

The programme will be conducted in LUCKNOW during January 27-February 8, 1992.

PARTICIPATION

No programme fee will be charged for Teachers of Engineering/Science Colleges and Polytechnics as DST is financing the programme. Participants will be reimbursed to and fro first class railfare or deluxe bus fare by shortest route for coming to the programme venue. Boarding/lodging will also be provided free-of-cost on non A/C double-occupancy basis, to the outstationed participants. Organizational sponsorship will be essential in all cases.

THE INSTITUTE

The Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India (**EDI**), set up in 1983 is an autonomous institution registered under the Societies Registration Act. Sponsored jointly by Industrial Development Bank of India (IDBI), Industrial Finance Corporation of India (IFCI), Industrial Credit and Investment Corporation of India (ICICI) and State Bank of India (SBI), with the active support of the Government of Gujarat, the Institute is a national resource centre governed by its own board. Committed to education, research and training in entrepreneurship, it has earned a great deal of national and international recognition for its efforts as reflected in the support it has received from the World Bank, International Labour Organization, UNIDO, Commonwealth Secretariat and several other international agencies.

ACHIEVEMENTS

During its short career, EDI has done a great deal to justify the faith with which it was setup. To list some of its notable achievements:

- About 1000 new entrepreneurs in various parts of the country have been developed through its own direct programmes. In addition, it has created a network of institutions throughout India which together have trained over 10000 first generation entrepreneurs.
- Atleast 50% of the persons so trained have set up their own ventures.
- The Institute has also developed about 200 trainers who are helping different state-level organizations and banks in their entrepreneurship development efforts.
- An EDP model developed by EDI is now implemented by more than 100 organisations in India and in several developing countries of Asia and Africa.
- And it has induced entrepreneurship-oriented inputs in schools and colleges curricula with a view to motivate youth for entrepreneurial career during their formative stage.
