(Entrepreneurship Training and Information Exchange for Small Businesses in India and Europe)

RATIONALE:

Amidst a scenario where myriad technological advances, to attain a truly global perspective, are occuring, it is indispensable for the small scale sector to find new markets for their products and services as also new partners for joint venture collaborations. Such inter regional alliances may crystallise in the form of technological, technical, financial, management and marketing tie-ups.

It is apparant that there is very little bilateral trade between SMEs in the European locations and those in India. Technological advancements, however, make transcontinental collaborations easier. It was, therefore, felt that linkages between the two could be immensely beneficial to both.

THE PROJECT:

The 'EU-India Economic Cross Cultural Programme' (ECCP) encourages cooperation between European Union and India in areas such as; Information & Culture, Research & Studies and Human Resource Development operating in three dimensions viz. University, Media and Entrepreneurial networking. Entrepreneurship Training and Information Exchange for Small Businesses in India and Europe (ENTRIXIE) Project, thus, aims at serving as a means to remove cross cultural barriers and apprehensions with regard to trade and investment relationships. The project will also serve as a focal point for information mobilisation and dissemination on enterprise-to-enterprise investment opportunities.

ENTRIXIE Project will initially target SME entrepreneurs of Bangalore and Ahmedabad in India and those in other three partner regions.


THE PARTNERS:

The partners involved in this project comprise (i) Training 2000, Blackburn, UK (ii) BfZ, Essen, Germany (iii) BfI, Linz, Austria and (iv) Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India, Ahmedabad, India. To begin with, the partners will interact and decide the industrial sectors based on their viability and presence in the participating locations.

OBJECTIVES:

The main objectives of the ENTRIXIE Project are:

- To improve reciprocal knowledge, understanding and mutual respect between SMEs of the EU and India, including national and regional differences within the small businesses of partner regions with a view to establishing and fostering fruitful business relationships.
- To develop and provide training and orientation programmes using telematics for owners and managers of small businesses in the partner regions who are interested in trans-continental co-operation.
- To demonstrate the potential and practicality of SME collaboration by arranging exchanges and seminars for Indian entrepreneurs in European businesses in the partner regions and for European entrepreneurs in India with the objective of facilitating partnerships involving SMEs from the two continents.



ACTIVITIES ORBITING AROUND THE MAIN OBJECTIVES:

- Collaborative development of the telematics delivery based on the TULIPS System already being used by the EU partners.
- Project launch and curriculum conference.
- Collaborative development of materials for entrepreneur training and tutorial assistance;
- Cross cultural information service developed by all partners;
- Designing of information supplied by all partners in such a way that it facilitates the formation of cross continental business arrangements;
- Assistance in the formation of practical partnerships between European and Indian SMEs.

THE IMMEDIATE BENEFITS:

The project is expected to add to the intrinsic strength of the small scale industries, substantially benefiting the small scale entrepreneurs, thus acting as a testimony to the fact that SSE sector can be a beehive of economic growth and development.

- An established partnership between the EDI, BfZ, BfI and Training 2000 will
 continue to offer entrepreneurship training using telematics and expand their
 scope of co-operation for the benefit of SMEs in their countries.
- A telematics based training system will be fully developed for operations in India and Europe. There will also be a tailor-made Entrepreneur Training Programme designed to take into account trading between the EU and India, covering conditions in each continent.
- Three joint cross continental partnerships with companies in Europe and India will work in close cooperation on their own projects.
- Indian entrepreneurs and European entrepreneurs will undergo training during the pilot operation with a view to doing business cross continentally.
- The partners in the project will have an access to information source and enjoy cross continental connections for the benefit of all SMEs, in their respective areas, who wish to conduct business across the continents.

PROFILE OF NETWORK ORGANIZATIONS:
