WHO CAN BE NOMINATED?

ACCREDITATION COURSE

Two phases viz. on the job training and refresher programme are added to this programme to facilitate earning of final accreditation certificate. The final accreditation is strongly recommended for the training officials of CEDs/IEDs. They are therefore advised to participate in all phases of the programme.

University Teachers, Business Counsellors, Consultants, Project Appraisal and Development Officers and all those who do not conduct Entrepreneurship Development Programmes are exempted from the accreditation phase and hence they do not have to participate in the course leading to Accreditation.

Certificate Course

THE INSTITUTE

The Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India (EDI-I) was set up in 1983 with the objective of developing entrepreneurship through education, teaching and research. Sponsored jointly by the Industrial Development Bank of India, Industrial Credit & Investment Corporation of India, Industrial Finance Corporation of India and State Bank of India, it is the national resource organisation to focus exclusively on entrepreneurship development. Autonomous in character, it is registered under the Societies Registration Act and is governed by its own Board.

During its short career, the EDI-I has developed about 1000 new entrepreneurs directly through its own programmes and another 10,000 through the programmes of a network of institutions created by it. It has developed about 200 trainers to help different state-level organisations and banks in their entrepreneurship development efforts and an EDP model developed by it, is being implemented by more than 100 organisations in India and several developing countries. Besides, the Institute has contributed significantly in introducing entrepreneurship oriented curricula in schools in various parts of the country. Twelve Teachers' Training Programmes were held and imparted training to about 240 teachers of engineering, polytechnics and science colleges all over the country to enable them to provide entrepreneurship related inputs. Its research studies have led to several major publications. It has an excellent library and documentation centre.

All these have earned great deal of national and international recognition for the Institute which is amply reflected in the support that the World Bank, International Labour Organisation, United Nations Industrial Development Organisation, Commonwealth Secretariat and several other international agencies have extended to its educational endeavours.
