## First Start-up Summit in Oct

Govt seeks close co-op between premier institutes, local bizmen

Ahmedabad: Gujarat government will organise a two-day Vibrant Gujarat Startup Summit 2016 beginning on October 21 in an effort to create a base for a modern start-up ecosystem, said a top state bureaucrat. This will be for the first time that start-ups are on the agenda of the government at the biannual Vibrant Gujarat Summit.

"This is a part of the effort to make Gujarat the top start-up destination for the manufacturing sector. We will invite speakers from the country as well as abroad," additional chief secretary in the industries and mines department Arvind Agarwal said on Friday.

The event will host more than 3,500 delegates including over 50 national and international speakers. Other attractions include over 5,000 B2B and B2G meetings, exhibitions, VC speed dating, business pitches and awards. Roadshows are planned in Surat, Vadodara, Rajkot, Anand, Mehsana, Mumbai, New Delhi, Hyderabad and Bengaluru.
