EDI trains delegates from nine countries

6-week long training programme is sponsored by ITEC

At a time when countries are working towards development of small nations such as Afghanistan, Nigeria and Bhutan, Ahmedabad's Entrepreneur Development Institute (EDI) has also made its contribution in a small way.
