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b iscrimination and denial of rights is disconcerting for any economy or section of people. A sizeable portion of Indian society is facing this depravity and is struggling to live a stigma free life. These are the people who suffer from different forms of disabilities and yearn to be a part of the mainstream.

Although India has one of the most progressive disability policy frameworks among developing countries, the challenge rests in effective operationalization of policy framework. It is, therefore, important to initiate measures that ensure effective support mobilization to ensure self reliance, autonomy, dignity and inclusiveness for the disabled. It is important to exhibit confidence in their potential and help them deal with

their limitations and overcome challenges through counseling, skill training and capacity building. Towards this, concerted efforts are required to target sustainable positive change. Proactive efforts towards integration of the disabled in every aspect of political, social, economic and cultural life is a must and a mandatory responsibility of the nation and its able citizens.

EDII has undertaken to set up 'Centre for Empowerment of Differently Abled', supported by the

Department of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of Gujarat. Initially, for three years, the Centre will be housed at the EDII Campus and ensure skill development and entrepreneurship training of 24,000 disabled people. The primary focus would be on Capacity building for self-employment, entrepreneurship and socially relevant incomegenerating activities. Enhancing employability skills and linkages with enterprises having social concerns for Differently Abled people would be an outcome that will be targeted through research, impact assessment studies and policy advisory.

EDII, therefore, looks forward to bringing about a conspicuous change in the lives of the differently abled and through them in the economy. Globally, the economy is changing rapidly, with its impact on every individual, segment and sector. Every market is undergoing change. There is opportunity for all, if harnessed carefully. Presence of skills and the abilities to run a business have, therefore, come to acquire paramount importance. Strategies, effective tactics, grounded in entrepreneurial receptivity are a necessity, if one has to navigate through the vicissitudes of business. And, the rule remains the same for differently abled too. EDII has, therefore, taken up this challenge.

'Enabling the disabled' is EDII's mandate, which it will approach through high levels of analysis, perceptive thoughts and strategies. Being in the business of creating entrepreneurs, it is all the more important for EDII to reset its methodologies, theories and domains to include the disadvantaged and the differently abled. The Institute has taken its first steps by recently completing a sizeable number of programmes for SC/ST community and by committing to set up the Centre for Differently Abled for their welfare.

A lot of out-of-the-box thinking, examination of external and internal factors and a scrutiny of several other aspects will together yield worthwhile results.

HERALDING New Beginnings



Reviving the **GLORY** of the **HANDLOOM** Sector

The project will be in implementation for 3 years and in its first phase six handloom clusters will be addressed across the country



 EDII and E&Y Join Hands to develop entrepreneurial competencies in about 5000 weavers, artisans and traders

ndia gets its identity from the word 'handloom'. Handloom has adorned India and has remained its distinct identity since time immemorial. Every state of India has its distinctiveness craftsmanship when it comes to handloom. But somewhere down the line, the handloom sector in India lost its sheen; it got coated with layers of obsoleteness, non-competitiveness, lack of advancement and nonprofitability, necessitating interventions to restore the sector's lost glitz and aura.

EDII and E&Y have joined hands to develop entrepreneurial competencies in about 5000 weavers, artisans and traders in six centres across the country to promote hand-made art of India. Bhuj and Surendranagar in Gujarat, Bargarh in Odisha, Kamrup in Assam, Maheshwar in Madhya Pradesh and Salem in Tamil Nadu are the selected handloom clusters for the project 'Hand Made in India' (HMI) which will be implemented over three years.

The Institute has evolved a model for upgrading skills of weavers, introducing new age marketing strategies, ensuring increased credit availability, leading to better income and improved quality of life in selected handloom clusters. Special focus will be given to empower women involved in weaving and allied activities.

"Traditional weavers and artisans in the handicraft industry have long struggled to survive due to the advent of power looms. However, the charm of a hand woven fabric has never faded and there is more awareness among people about such products. To calibrate these artisans to newer markets and shift in customer's preference for sustainable products, we have initiated the Hand Made in India (HMI) project. The aim of this initiative is to revive the lives of weavers by handholding them in developing entrepreneurial competencies. India is a land of diversity and from every region we can find different craftsmanship which requires special intervention and that is what we aim at evolving and implementing," said Dr. Raman Gujral, Sr. Faculty, EDII.

The project would concentrate on product development to capture larger and high end markets with special focus on exports. New collections and clothing line through product diversification, in collaboration with renowned fashion designers and fashion institutes will be introduced through this project. The weavers and artisans would be handheld to match steps with the contemporary trends so that they make a mark for themselves in the world of business.


EDII **OPENED** doors to the first ever **SSIP ANNUAL** Conference 2019

This conference, conducted during 6-7 June, 2019, at EDII Campus was first-of-its-kind in India to promote students' startup initiative. The idea is to make it a flagship programme under the SSIP, to be conducted every year with the primary objective of providing a platform to academic researchers, practising professionals and others to present their research ideas around the theme of startups and innovations.

create end-to-end ecosystem for student innovation and start-ups. These interventions have received attention from academia, industry and public policy makers at national and international levels, "said Shri Chudasama. The Hon'ble Minister also shared a few examples of unique start-up ideas which had helped society at large.

Dr J N Singh, Chief Secretary, Government of Gujarat said "Under Chairmanship of Shri Narendra Modi, Hon'ble Prime Minister of India and other senior cabinet ministers, Union Cabinet took an important decision to form a subcommittee primarily focusing on employment and skill development. Perhaps for the very first time, a high powered body has been made. The motive behind the formation of the body is majorly for employment generation among the youth. We are proud to have a potent democratic dividend. We are fortunate to be in Gujarat, a state which has tremendous entrepreneurial culture and an ecosystem where aid and assistance are easily available."

Smt. Anju Sharma, Principal Secretary, Education Department, Government of Gujarat, stated that the Education department aims to benchmark the best performing ecosystem to instil a culture of excellence and drive collaborative competition in the ecosystem. "We will also be offering monetary and non-monetary awards/citations to attract more student led innovations," she announced. She also mentioned that there are more than 100 colleges registered so far under SSIP in India; wherein 74 institutes are placed in phase 4. Under

these, 400 innovative projects and more than 500 patents have been registered. Various start-up eco-channels such as, Start-up Programmes (for students in their first phase), Start-up SATHI (where the entrepreneurs can leverage best mentors for their start-ups), Start-up BLOOM (where more than 45 patents have been registered), Start-up MART (an e-commerce platform cum marketing space for star-ups), Start-up PROMOTION and Start-up MANAK (for facilitating certification related formalities) and many more have been introduced by the Government of Gujarat with an aim to ensure the best for budding entrepreneurs. She concluded her speech by mentioning that the Government of Gujarat is bringing a paradigm shift in higher education system which will help in job creation by the younger generation.

Shri Kris Gopalakrishnan, Co-founder, Infosys and Chairman, Axilor Ventures in his address said, "Entrepreneurship is a cultural behavior. In the Indian economy, 70% of the Start-ups are referred to as Small and Medium enterprises with an average of 20 employees. We also need significant start-ups in rural areas of the country for upliftment of these areas."

Prof Anil Sahasrabudhe, Chairman, AICTE highlighted that in last 5 years there has been an extraordinary growth in terms of innovation

He said, "After introducing Smart India Hackathon, we have received immense support of young entrepreneurs with their creativity and innovative ideas and few of them have been implemented by the Government of India. More than 5 crore jobs could be created through start-ups alone and the winning Gujarat model should be exported across the country."

Under SSIP, Government of Gujarat has a goal of harnessing and upscaling 500 students' startups in the next 5 years. "During the last decade, new entrepreneurs who do not belong to traditional business communities have begun to emerge in large numbers. It has been observed that academic institutions are increasingly becoming a medium for such entrepreneurs. This has led to a spur in youth creativity and innovation," opined Smt. Avantika Singh Aulakh, CEO, GKS, Commissioner, Technical Education, Government of Gujarat.

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Innovation level of **INDIAN** youth entrepreneurs **HIGHEST** among Asia-Pacific: **GEM** Report

he Global Entrepreneurship Monitor (GEM) Survey is the largest annual study of entrepreneurial dynamics in the world. GEM was conceived in 1999 and has since been venerated for the credibility and coverage of its research. With the Indian Entrepreneurial Eco-system becoming robust by the day, the GEM-India Consortium is assuming a major role in probing the rapidly evolving nature and the level of entrepreneurship in India.

Gem India National Report 2017-2018 revealed some interesting parameters related to Innovation level of Indian youth entrepreneurs.

The innovation level of youth entrepreneurs in India is highest among Asia and the Pacific region as per latest survey by Global Entrepreneurship Monitor (GEM) and Youth Co:Lab. As per survey, around 55% of Total Early-stage Entrepreneurial Activity (TEA) showed innovation-orientation for

ntrepreneurial opportunities that leverage local resources can not just alleviate poverty and unemployment but can also ensure optimal use of local resources. India's villages offer immense scope in this space. As a National Resource Organization (NRO) for Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India's Start-up Village Entrepreneurship Programme (SVEP), EDII has been maximising scope for development of rural entrepreneurship. SVEP focuses on promoting rural entrepreneurship by developing a sustainable model for Village Entrepreneurship promotion through integrated ICT techniques and tools for training & capacity building and enterprise advisory services. It also aims at developing local resources by training a pool of village level community cadre [Community Resource Persons – Enterprise Promotion (CRP - EPs)] and building the capacity of the National Rural Livelihood Missions and SHG federations to monitor and direct the work of the CRP-EPs. The Institute is working in 42 blocks spread across 11 states of India.

Till date, 811 enterprises have accessed loans worth Rs. 2.79 Cr. from various financial organisations. Periodic meetings with bankers at the block, district and state levels, and engaging them in the decision making process in some blocks, has resulted in sensitizing bankers and raising possibilities of finance for eligible entrepreneurs.

23,606 enterprises have been promoted and Rs. 62.66 crores has been disbursed so far. The repayment rate on an average, across 34 blocks, is approximately 95%.

2 batches of Residential Training of eight days each, of Block Programme Managers, sponsored by Ministry of Rural Development, Govt. of India, were organized at EDII to develop necessary skills and knowledge for effective implementation of the SVEP at the field level. The 5th batch of SVEP BPM commenced on 21st May 2019 and concluded on 28th May 2019 and the 6th batch commenced on 18th June and concluded on 25th June 2019.

Field level training on SVEP software was also conducted for Community Resource Persons in 38 blocks of 11 states which helped CRP-EPs prepare business plans and track the progress of enterprises on the mobile app.

ACCELERATING Women Entrepreneurship... PROJECT UDAYA

he entrepreneurship landscape of the country is dotted with stories of grit and strength of women entrepreneurs. If entrepreneurship supports economic growth, it could well be believed that women are the major catalysts in this process. If a country's potential has to be harnessed, entrepreneurship needs to be encouraged with emphasis on creating enabling factors that accommodate both men and women potential entrepreneurs.

A 2015 study by McKinsey has shown that with equal participation of women in the economy, India's GDP can rise by 16-60% by 2025, which means an addition of \$2.9 trillion to the Indian economy.

EDII has been significantly contributing to women entrepreneurship and has closely dealt with the problems and concerns that are most often specific to women seeking to set up their businesses. Given this background and with the resolve to make a further meaningful contribution, EDII joined hands with TATA Communications Ltd. in

Project Udaya, to promote entrepreneurship among women from SC/ST, weaker sections and SHG members for sustainable income generation through enterprise creation. The project will develop entrepreneurial capabilities a mong potential women beneficiaries; strengthen their knowledge, skills and behavioral attributes to initiate, plan and implement entrepreneurship development activities effectively. Participants^a were also trained in business environment scanning, identification & selection of business opportunities, commercial analysis of business opportunities and preparation of project report. The most tangible outcome of the project will be reflected in completely enabling trained women entrepreneurs to establish & manage their enterprise.

The project was launched on June 4, 2019 at Alibaug, Raigarh district of Maharashtra. Various esteemed dignitaries graced the launching ceremony with their presence. The

Science & **TECHNOLOGY** Gain Firmer **GROUNDS** in **ENTREPRENEURSHIP**

ntrepreneurship exposure aligns the capabilities of students with the demands of the markets. Entrepreneurial capabilities encourage independent thinking, foster creativity and nurture the spirit of innovation. Simultaneously, an amiable ecosystem has to be established with all stakeholders duly sensitised about the benefits of pursuing entrepreneurship, so as to spur entrepreneurial incidences in a big way. EDII in collaboration with Department of Science and Technology (DST), Government of India conducted different workshops and programmes to train and educate students on adopting entrepreneurship as a career. Faculty members of different academic institutions were trained to master the finer nuances of entrepreneurship so that they could impart effective learning to students. Over last four months, EDII's South Regional Office conducted five programmes on various subjects, viz; Entrepreneurship Awareness Camps (EACs), Entrepreneurship

Development Programmes (EDPs), Women Entrepreneurship **Development Programmes** (WEDPs), Technology based Entrepreneurship Development Programmes (TEDPs) and Faculty Development Programmes (FDPs). More than 1500 students and faculty members benefitted from these programmes. While Dr. Raman Gujral, Senior Faculty, EDII monitors activities under DST in the southern region, at the national level DST supported programmes are coordinated and directed by senior faculty member, Mr. S. B. Sareen

Entrepreneurship Awareness Camps (EACs)

Impressing upon students to pursue entrepreneurship is important to ensure long term results. Awareness Camps are proven ways to impact the mindset of students in favour of entrepreneurship. EDII conducted around 18 EACs in the period of 2018-19 which witnessed more than 1500 students from science and technology background and were taught various nuances of innovation and creativity in order to establish their own



enterprise in the future. The three-day programme witnessed participants from various places in Karnataka and Tamil Nadu.

Entrepreneurship Development Programme (EDP)

One-month EDP was conducted at the Syed Hameeda Arts and Science College, Tamil Nadu during March 11 - April 11 2019. 25 participants who enrolled in the programme were guided and mentored by some of the best experts in the field of entrepreneurship. The feedback was positive and majority of the participants expressed that they were inspired and learnt how to start their own enterprise. The programme addressed 'knowledge', 'skills' and 'attitude' so as to groom potential entrepreneurs and impart learning on entrepreneurial traits, markets, networking, policies and schemes, business opportunity identification, business plan preparation, technical parameters and related aspects.

Women Entrepreneurship Development Programme (WEDP)

Given their unique management skills and abilities, women need to be provided with cordial conditions to set up

their business. While a sensitized support system is greatly helpful, entrepreneurial training imparted to potential women entrepreneurs can go a long way in ensuring their growth as able entrepreneurs. WEDPs are targeted at driving in an understanding to women so that they overcome certain conditions, typical to them and choose opportunities that suit their schedules, comfort level, inclinations, likes and dislikes. As a part of DST-NIMAT 2018-19, two WEDPs of 4 weeks each, were conducted. EDII collaborated with We n We Visionary, a non-profit organization, Bangalore and Thiagarajar College, Madurai to conduct these workshops. The outcome of the two WEDPs was impact making with women not just learning how to do business

but also shortlisting and identifying opportunities, networking, preparing business plans and finalizing the nitty-gritty of setting up their enterprise. 58 women successfully completed the programme with 25 participants in the first WEDP and 33 participants in the second programme.

Technology based Entrepreneurship Development Programme (TEDP)

Technical Orientation strengthens the talent pool. Be it existing or potential entrepreneurs, technical skill upgradation, coupled with k n o w l e d g e o n entrepreneurship can ensure sustained successful performance. The potential

entrepreneur develops faith in his/her technical knowledge, derives motivation, nurtures a vision, belief and perception which drives effective action. Against this backdrop, EDII, southern regional office conducted two 6-week TEDPs. The focus area was Artificial Intelligence. 49 students were trained to be technically sound entrepreneurs during this programme.

Faculty Development Programme (FDP)

Against the backdrop that faculty group can influence, train and motivate students to opt for entrepreneurship, EDII conducted FDP to train and develop 23 professionals in entrepreneurship development at Alagappa University, Tamil Nadu. This cadre of resource persons would play a crucial role in guiding and motivating young students from science and technology background to consider entrepreneurship as a career.

Post each programme, a feedback was taken which showcased that 75% of the TEDP participants felt confident about starting their own enterprise in Artificial Intelligence (AI) and 80% of women participants from WEDP programme were certain about starting their own enterprise. Most of the participants have identified their business opportunity and are ready with their business plan. EDII is handholding many.


Science and TECHNOLOGY Takes Mega LEAPS...

entering new markets or introducing new products, service or processes that are unique to market. Only youth entrepreneurs from Australia had similar level of innovation-orientation among total of nine countries studied by GEM consortium.

Innovation from the GEM perspective is often measured by examining R&D investment, intellectual property generation, and STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) education. The GEM survey adopts both a self-assessment (compared to local competition) and a classification based on the industry the entrepreneurs are active in.

According to survey, Indian youth entrepreneurs also had third lowest fear of failure at 31.9% behind Republic of Korea at 30.8% and Malaysia at 31.5%.

Remarking on the readings of the

survey, Dr. Sunil Shukla, GEM India Team Leader and Director, EDII-Ahmedabad said, "Over last few years, the start-up ecosystem in India has strengthened considerably across value chain, thereby providing them an opportunity to innovate and offer products and services that are new and unique for their consumers. The influx of capital from private equity and venture capital funds in Indian startups prove the growth of start-up ecosystem. The innovation level among youth entrepreneurs in India is not surprising when you look at number of successful enterprises that have come up in healthtech. edutech, fintech and foodtech using technology as key ingredient."

Dr. Amit Dwivedi, Faculty, EDII & National Team Member, GEM India Chapter and I said, "Innovation is a core driver of economic and business growth and job creation

According to GEM, in a global comparison, innovation levels in Asia and the Pacific rank behind North America and Europe and ahead of Africa and Latin America and the Caribbean, 25.4% TEA in Asia and the Pacific regard their products or services as new to all or some customers and perceive few or no competitors with the same product on offer.



ntrepreneurship has had an impact on every nook and corner of the world. Its advantages are unique as it compels an individual to rethink his/her innovative capability, generating indelible results for oneself and the economy. The Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation (ITEC) is a bilateral programme of assistance launched by the Government of India wherein close to 162 countries from Asia, East Europe, Africa, Latin America, the Caribbean as well as Pacific and Small Island countries are invited to share the Indian development experience. The idea is to reach out to other countries by offering a helping hand through sharing of knowledge and opportunities.

Every year EDIP undertakes focussed entrepreneurship and capacity building programmes for working professionals from different countries. Over the last three months, three International

government organizations, funding agencies, NGOs, business and industry, educational institutes, financial sectors etc.

This year, the programme on Informal Sector Enterprise, Entrepreneurship & Local **Economic Development received** 28 participants from 13 countries viz., Botswana, Chile, Ethiopia, Kenya, Mauritius, Namibia, Niger, Nepal, Samoa, Sri Lanka, Tanzania, Turkey and Zambia. Briefing on the programme, Dr. Kavita Saxena, Programme Director said that the focus was on providing necessary knowledge and skills to design and implement Local Economic and Development Strategies. She explained that they were also equipped with skills, tools and techniques to assess the state of territory/locality by identifying the strong elements, opportunities, weaknesses and threats, thereby imparting

outcome based market-oriented strategy perspective.

The study tour of 4 days was also conducted where the participants were taken to relevant industries and exposed to different aspects of informal sector and LED in the Indian context. They also visited CrAdLE - EDII's incubation centre and interacted with its CEO-Mr. Mavank Patel to understand the various levels at which an incubator works to ensure self sustenance of enterprises. At the end of the programme, participants prepared and presented an Action Plan highlighting the initiatives they would like to take, back home, based on the learning from the programme. Overall, the programme received excellent feedback and the participants suggested continuing with such programme so that their fellow officials could also get benefit from the programme.

The Cluster Development Executives (CDEs) Programme received 12 participants from 7 countries viz. Argentina, Ethiopia, Kenya, Krygyzstan, South Sudan, Sri Lanka and Zambia. With Dr. Sanjay Pal, as Programme Director, the programme focused on improving the knowledge and skills of participants to impart learning on successful implementation of a Cluster Development Programme. "The participants learnt about developing a long term vision for the cluster, value chain analysis and business profiling. They were also taught on how to establish Common Facility Centre (CFC) under Private-Public-Partnership (PPP) approach. I am delighted to share that we have received excellent feedback for the programme," remarked Dr. Pal.

The programme Industrial, Infrastructure and Sustainable Project Preparation and Appraisal received 19 participants from countries viz. Egypt, Ethiopia, Kenya, Nigeria, South Sudan, Sri Lanka, Tanzania, Uzbekistan and Zimbabwe. The participants comprised officials from industry and economic ministries, investment promotional agencies, chambers of commerce and industry, development bodies, development financial institutions, commercial banks, business and management development organization and academicians, among others.

Dr. Saji Kumar, Programme Director said, "The objective of the programme was to help participants identify industrial, infrastructure and sustainable opportunities that would lead to improved viability, returns and effective investment decisions. This programme will help participants improvise their decision making skills by updating their knowledge in various areas of the project."

The six-week programmes comprised four weeks of classroom training and two weeks of study tour. Field visits formed a major component of the course as they helped participants understand various facets of Indian economy and culture. The visits included tours to different industries based in Gujarat like Madhur Dairy (Gandhinagar), GIFT City (Gandhinagar), Naroda Industrial Estate (Ahmedabad), various Common Facility Centres and the like.

The valediction for these programmes took place at EDII campus on April 12, 2019. The Chief Guest for the Valediction Ceremony. Dr. Devyani Khobragade, IFS & Joint Secretary, DPA-II, Ministry of External Affairs, Govt. of India and the Guest of Honour was Shri Kartikeya Sarabhai, Founder & Director of Centre for Environment Education
